## HB-5073, As Passed Senate, December 12, 2013

## HOUSE BILL No. 5073

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 675 (MCL 257.675), as amended by 2004 PA 151.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 675. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and
 this chapter, a vehicle stopped or parked upon a highway or street
 shall be stopped or parked with the wheels of the vehicle parallel
 to the roadway and within 12 inches of any curb existing at the
 right of the vehicle.

(2) A local authority may by ordinance permit parking of a vehicle on a 1-way roadway with the vehicle's left wheels adjacent to and within 12 inches of any curb existing at the left of the vehicle.

(3) A local authority may by ordinance permit angle parking on
 a roadway, except that angle parking shall not be permitted on a
 state trunk line highway UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY THE STATE
 TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT.

5 (4) The state transportation commission with respect to state 6 trunk line highways and the board of county road commissioners with respect to county roads, acting jointly with the director of the 7 department of state police, may place signs prohibiting or 8 9 restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on a 10 highway where, in the opinion of the officials as determined by an 11 engineering survey, the stopping, standing, or parking is dangerous 12 to those using the highway or where the stopping, standing, or 13 parking of vehicles would unduly interfere with the free movement 14 of traffic on the highway or street. The signs shall be official 15 signs and a person shall not stop, stand, or park a vehicle in 16 violation of the restrictions stated on the signs. The signs shall 17 be installed only after a proper traffic order is filed with the 18 county clerk. Upon the application to the state transportation 19 commission by a home rule city affected by an order, opportunity 20 shall be given to the city for a hearing before the state 21 transportation commission, pursuant to UNDER the administrative 22 procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, except 23 when an ordinance of the home rule city prohibits or restricts the 24 parking of vehicles on a state trunk line highway; when the home rule city, by lawfully authorized official action, requests the 25 state transportation department to prohibit or restrict parking on 26 27 a state trunk line highway; or when the home rule city enters into

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1 a construction agreement with the state transportation department 2 providing for the prohibition or restriction of parking on a state trunk line highway during or after the period of construction. 3 4 Traffic control orders, so long as they affect parking upon a state 5 trunk line highway within the corporate limits of a home rule city, 6 are considered "rules" within the meaning of the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, and upon 7 application for a hearing by a home rule city, the proceedings 8 9 before the state transportation commission shall be considered a 10 "contested case" within the meaning of that act.

11 (5) A disabled person may apply, on a form prescribed by the 12 secretary of state, for a serially numbered nontransferable 13 temporary or permanent windshield placard for the personal use of 14 the disabled person. An individual who has a religious objection to 15 having a medical examination may personally apply at a branch office of the secretary of state for a serially numbered 16 17 nontransferable temporary or permanent windshield placard for the 18 personal use of the disabled individual. If it appears obvious that the individual has a qualifying disability, the individual shall 19 20 not be required to present a medical statement attesting to the disability. The application for and the issuance of the serially 21 22 numbered nontransferable temporary or permanent windshield placard 23 is subject to all of the following:

(a) The secretary of state may issue to a disabled person with
a temporary disability a temporary windshield placard that is valid
for a period of not more than 6 months.

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(b) The secretary of state may issue to a disabled person with

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a permanent disability an original or renewal permanent windshield
 placard that is valid for at least A PERIOD OF NOT MORE THAN 4
 years.

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4 (c) An original certificate of identification or permanent
5 windshield placard shall expire EXPIRES on the disabled person's
6 fifth birthday after the date of issuance.

7 (d) A renewal permanent windshield placard shall expire
8 EXPIRES on the disabled person's fourth birthday after the date of
9 renewal.

10 (e) A-EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, NOT 11 MORE THAN 45 DAYS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE EXPIRATION OF HIS OR 12 HER CERTIFICATE OR PLACARD, A person holding a certificate of 13 identification or permanent windshield placard at any time within 14 45 days before the expiration of his or her certificate or placard 15 may make application APPLY for a new or renewal placard as provided for in this section. However, if the person will be out of state 16 17 during the 45 days immediately preceding expiration of the 18 certificate or placard or for other good cause shown cannot apply 19 for a placard within the 45-day period, application THE PERSON MAY 20 APPLY for a new or renewal placard may be made not more than 6 months before expiration of the certificate or placard EXPIRES. A 21 22 placard issued or renewed under this subdivision shall expire EXPIRES as provided for in this subsection. 23

(f) Upon application in the manner prescribed by the secretary
 of state for replacement of a lost, stolen, or destroyed
 certificate or placard described in this section, a disabled person
 or organization that provides specialized services to disabled

persons may be issued a placard that in substance duplicates the
 original certificate or placard for a fee of \$10.00.

3 (g) A <del>certificate or</del> placard described in this section may be used by a person other than the disabled person for the sole 4 5 purpose of transporting the disabled person. An organization that 6 provides specialized services to disabled persons may apply for and receive a permanent windshield placard to be used in any motor 7 vehicle actually transporting a disabled person. If the 8 9 organization ceases to transport disabled persons, the placard 10 shall be returned to the secretary of state for cancellation and 11 destruction.

12 (6) A disabled person with a certificate of identification, windshield placard, special registration plates issued under 13 14 section 803d, a special registration plate issued under section 15 803f that has a tab for persons with disabilities attached, a certificate of identification or windshield placard from another 16 17 state, or special registration plates from another state issued for 18 persons with disabilities is entitled to courtesy in the parking of 19 a vehicle. The courtesy shall relieve the disabled person or the 20 person transporting the disabled person from liability for a violation with respect to parking, other than in violation of this 21 act. A local authority may by ordinance prohibit parking on a 22 23 street or highway to create a fire lane or to provide for the 24 accommodation of heavy traffic during morning and afternoon rush 25 hours, and the privileges extending to veterans and physically 26 disabled persons under this subsection do not supersede that 27 ordinance.

1 (7) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (24), an 2 application for an initial free parking sticker shall contain a 3 certification by a physician, physician assistant, or certified 4 nurse practitioner licensed to practice in this state attesting to 5 the nature and estimated duration of the applicant's disabling condition and verifying that the applicant qualifies for a free 6 parking sticker. An individual who has a religious objection to 7 having a medical examination may personally apply at a branch 8 9 office of the secretary of state for an initial free parking 10 sticker. If it appears obvious that the individual is unable to do 11 1 or more of the acts listed in subdivisions (a) to (d), the 12 individual shall not be IS NOT required to present a certification by a physician, a physician assistant, or a certified nurse 13 practitioner attesting to the nature and estimated duration of the 14 15 applicant's disabling condition or verifying that the applicant qualifies for a free parking sticker. The applicant qualifies for a 16 17 free parking sticker if the applicant is a licensed driver and the physician, physician assistant, or certified nurse practitioner 18 19 certifies or, if an individual is not required to have a 20 certification by a physician, a physician assistant, or a certified nurse practitioner, it is obvious that the applicant is unable to 21 do 1 or more of the following: 22

(a) Manage, manipulate, or insert coins, or obtain tickets or
tokens in parking meters or ticket machines in parking lots or
parking structures, due to the lack of fine motor control of both
hands.

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(b) Reach above his or her head to a height of 42 inches from

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the ground, due to a lack of finger, hand, or upper extremity
 strength or mobility.

3 (c) Approach a parking meter due to his or her use of a4 wheelchair or other device.

5 (d) Walk more than 20 feet due to an orthopedic, neurological,
6 cardiovascular, or lung condition in which the degree of
7 debilitation is so severe that it almost completely impedes the
8 ability to walk.

9 (8) To be entitled to free parking in a metered space or in a
10 publicly owned parking structure or area, a vehicle must properly
11 display 1 of the following:

12 (a) A windshield placard bearing a free parking sticker issued
13 pursuant to UNDER this act.

14 (b) A valid certificate of identification issued before
15 October 1, 1994.

16 (B) (c) A valid windshield placard issued by another state.

17 (C) (d) A certificate of identification issued by another
18 state.

(D) (e) A license plate for persons with disabilities issued
by another state.

(E) (f) A special registration plate with a tab for persons
with disabilities attached issued by another state.

(9) A vehicle that does not properly display 1 of the items
listed in subsection (8) is not entitled to free parking in a
metered parking space or in a publicly owned parking area or
structure, and the disabled person or vehicle operator shall pay
all parking fees and may be responsible for a civil infraction.

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(10) Blindness that is not accompanied by an incapacity
 described in subsection (7) does not entitle a person to a free
 parking sticker.

4 (11) The secretary of state shall attach a free parking
5 sticker, in contrasting colors, to the windshield placard of a
6 person certified as having an incapacity described in subsection
7 (7).

(12) A windshield placard issued under this section shall be 8 9 displayed on the interior rearview mirror of the vehicle or, if 10 there is no interior rearview mirror, on the lower left corner of 11 the dashboard while the vehicle is parked or being parked by or 12 under the direction of a disabled person pursuant to this section. (13) A certificate of identification issued before February 13 14 11, 1992 shall be displayed on the lower left corner of the 15 dashboard of the parked vehicle.

(13) (14) Upon conviction of an offense involving a violation 16 17 of the special privileges conferred upon a holder of a certificate 18 of identification, windshield placard , or free parking sticker, a 19 magistrate or judge trying the case, as a part of any penalty 20 imposed, may confiscate the serially numbered certificate of identification, windshield placard , or free parking sticker and 21 22 return the confiscated item or items to the secretary of state together with a certified copy of the sentence imposed. Upon 23 24 receipt of a certificate of identification, windshield placard , or free parking sticker from a judge or magistrate, the secretary of 25 state shall cancel and destroy the <del>certificate,</del> placard , or 26 27 sticker, and the disabled person to whom it was issued shall not

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1 receive another certificate, placard , or sticker until he or she 2 submits a completed application and presents a current medical 3 statement attesting to his or her condition. A law enforcement 4 officer who observes a misuse of a certificate of identification, 5 windshield placard , or free parking sticker may immediately 6 confiscate the certificate, placard , or sticker and forward it 7 with a copy of his or her report to the secretary of state.

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(14) (15) A person who intentionally makes a false statement 8 9 of material fact or commits or attempts to commit a deception or 10 fraud on a medical statement attesting to a disability, submitted 11 in support of an application for a certificate of identification, 12 windshield placard, free parking sticker, special registration plate, or tab for persons with disabilities under this section, 13 section 803d, or section 803f, is guilty of a misdemeanor -14 15 punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment for 16 not more than 30 days, or both.

17 (15) (16) A person who commits or attempts to commit a 18 deception or fraud by 1 or more of the following methods is guilty 19 of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or 20 imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both:

(a) Using a certificate of identification, windshield placard
, or free parking sticker issued under this section or by another
state to provide transportation to a disabled person, when IF the
person is not providing transportation to a disabled person.

(b) Altering, modifying, or selling a certificate of
identification, windshield placard , or free parking sticker issued
under this section or by another state.

(c) Copying or forging a certificate of identification,
 windshield placard , or free parking sticker described in this
 section or selling a copied or forged certificate, placard , or
 sticker described in this section. In the case of a violation of
 this subdivision, the fine described in this subsection shall be
 not less than \$250.00.

7 (d) Using a copied or forged certificate of identification,
8 windshield placard , or free parking sticker described in this
9 section.

10 (e) Making a false statement of material fact to obtain or 11 assist an individual in obtaining a certificate, placard , or 12 sticker described in this section, a special registration plate 13 under section 803d, or a tab for persons with disabilities under 14 section 803f.

(f) Knowingly using or displaying a certificate, placard, or sticker described in this section that has been canceled by the secretary of state.

18 (16) (17) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a
19 person who violates this section is responsible for a civil
20 infraction.

(18) A certificate of identification issued before October 1, 1994 and containing an expiration date is valid for free parking in a space controlled or regulated by a meter on a public highway or in a publicly owned parking area or structure when the time for parking indicated on the meter has expired, or in a parking space clearly identified by an official sign as being reserved for use by disabled persons that is on public property or private property

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1 available for public use, until the expiration date printed on the 2 certificate. The certificate expires and shall be canceled on its 3 expiration date.

4 (19) A certificate of identification issued before October 1,
5 1994 that does not contain an expiration date expires and shall be
6 canceled on October 1, 1994.

7 (20) A certificate of identification shall not be issued or
8 renewed by the secretary of state after October 1, 1994.

9 (17) (21) The secretary of state may cancel, revoke, or 10 suspend a windshield placard — OR free parking sticker — or 11 certificate of identification under any of the following 12 circumstances:

13 (a) The secretary of state determines that a windshield
14 placard , OR free parking sticker , or certificate of
15 identification was fraudulently or erroneously issued.

(b) The secretary of state determines that a person has made
or is making an unlawful use of his or her windshield placard , OR
free parking sticker. , or certificate of identification.

19 (c) The secretary of state determines that a check or draft 20 used to pay the required fee is not paid on its first presentation 21 and is not paid upon reasonable notice or demand or that the 22 required fee is paid by an invalid credit card.

(d) The secretary of state determines that the person is no
longer eligible to receive or use a windshield placard - OR free
parking sticker. - or certificate of identification.

26 (e) The secretary of state determines that the owner has27 committed an offense under this act involving a windshield placard

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, OR free parking sticker. , or certificate of identification.

2 (f) A person has violated this act and the secretary of state
3 is authorized under this act to cancel, revoke, or suspend a
4 windshield placard , OR free parking sticker , or certificate of
5 identification for that violation.

(g) The secretary of state receives notice from another state
or foreign country that a windshield placard , OR free parking
sticker , or certificate of identification issued by the secretary
of state has been surrendered by the owner or seized in conformity
with the laws of that other state or foreign country , or has been
improperly used or displayed in violation of the laws of that other
state or foreign country.

(18) (22) Before a cancellation, revocation, or suspension
 under subsection (21), (17), the person affected thereby BY THAT
 ACTION shall be given notice and an opportunity to be heard.

(19) (23) A windshield placard issued to a disabled person shall bear the first letter and the last 3 digits of the disabled person's driver's or chauffeur's license number or the first letter and the last 4 digits of the number on his or her official state personal identification card issued under 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291 to 28.300.

(20) (24) For purposes of this section only, the secretary of state may accept an application for a windshield placard, special registration plate, or free parking sticker from a disabled person that is signed by a physician, physician assistant, or certified nurse practitioner licensed or certified to practice in another state if the application is accompanied by a copy of that

1 physician's, physician assistant's, or certified nurse

2 practitioner's current medical license or certification issued by 3 that state.

4 (21) (25)—This section does not require new or additional
5 third party reimbursement or worker's compensation benefits for
6 services rendered.
