11 MICHIGAN NATURAL RESOURCES TRUST FUND

12 Sec. 301. (1) The department of natural resources shall enter 13 into agreements with local units of government for the purpose of administering the grants identified in part 1. Among other 14 15 provisions, the agreements shall require that grant recipients 16 agree to dedicate to public outdoor recreation uses in perpetuity 17 the land acquired or developed; to replace lands converted or lost 18 to other than public outdoor recreation use; and, for parcels 19 acquired that are over 5 acres in size, to provide the state with a 20 nonparticipating 1/6 minimum royalty interest in any acquired 21 minerals that are retained by the grant recipient.

(2) The agreements under subsection (1) shall also provide
that the full payments of grants shall be made only after proof of
acquisition, or proof of completion of the development project, is
submitted by the grant recipient and all costs are verified by the
department of natural resources. This requirement may be waived by
