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HOUSE BILL No. 4875

September 17, 2015, Introduced by Rep. Lucido and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 2011 PA 256, entitled "Michigan fireworks safety act,"

by amending sections 2 and 12 (MCL 28.452 and 28.462), section 2 as amended by 2012 PA 257 and section 12 as amended by 2013 PA 65.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Agricultural and wildlife fireworks" means fireworks devices distributed to farmers, ranchers, and growers through a wildlife management program administered by the United States department DEPARTMENT of the interior INTERIOR or the department of natural resources of this state.
 - (b) "APA standard 87-1" means 2001 APA standard 87-1, standard for construction and approval for transportation of fireworks, novelties, and theatrical pyrotechnics, published by the American pyrotechnics association PYROTECHNICS ASSOCIATION of Bethesda,

- 2 (c) "Articles pyrotechnic" means pyrotechnic devices for
- 3 professional use that are similar to consumer fireworks in chemical
- 4 composition and construction but not intended for consumer use,
- 5 that meet the weight limits for consumer fireworks but are not
- 6 labeled as such, and that are classified as UN0431 or UN0432 under
- **7** 49 CFR 172.101.
- 8 (d) "Citation" means that term A CITATION as described in
- 9 section 17a.
- 10 (e) "Commercial manufacturer" means a person engaged in the
- 11 manufacture of consumer fireworks.
- 12 (f) "Consumer fireworks" means fireworks devices that are
- 13 designed to produce visible effects by combustion, that are
- 14 required to comply with the construction, chemical composition, and
- 15 labeling regulations promulgated by the United States consumer
- 16 product safety commission CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION under
- 17 16 CFR parts 1500 and 1507, and that are listed in APA standard 87-
- 18 1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3, or 3.5. Consumer fireworks does_DO not include
- 19 low-impact fireworks.
- 20 (g) "Consumer fireworks certificate" means a certificate
- 21 issued under section 4.
- (h) "Department" means the department of licensing and
- 23 regulatory affairs.
- 24 (i) "Display fireworks" means large fireworks devices that are
- 25 explosive materials intended for use in fireworks displays and
- 26 designed to produce visible or audible effects by combustion,
- 27 deflagration, or detonation, as provided in 27 CFR 555.11, 49 CFR

- 1 172, and APA standard 87-1, 4.1.
- 2 (j) "Firework" or "fireworks" means any composition or device,
- 3 except for a starting pistol, a flare gun, or a flare, designed for
- 4 the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion,
- 5 deflagration, or detonation. Fireworks consist of consumer
- 6 fireworks, low-impact fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, display
- 7 fireworks, and special effects.
- 8 (k) "Fireworks safety fund" means the fireworks safety fund
- 9 created in section 11.
- 10 (1) "Local unit of government" means a city, village, or
- 11 township.
- 12 (m) "Low-impact fireworks" means ground and handheld sparkling
- 13 devices as that phrase is defined under APA standard 87-1, 3.1,
- **14** 3.1.1.1 to 3.1.1.8, and 3.5.
- (n) "Minor" means an individual who is less than 18 years of
- **16** age.
- 17 (o) "NFPA" means the national fire protection association
- 18 NATIONAL FIRE PROTECTION ASSOCIATION headquartered at 1
- 19 Batterymarch Park, Quincy, Massachusetts.
- 20 (p) "NFPA 1" means the uniform fire code, 2006 edition,
- 21 developed by NFPA.
- 22 (q) "NFPA 72" means the "National Fire Alarm Code", 2002
- 23 edition, developed by NFPA.
- (r) "NFPA 101" means the "Life Safety Code", 2009 edition,
- 25 developed by NFPA.
- 26 (s) "NFPA 1123" means the "Code for Fireworks Display", 2010
- 27 edition, developed by NFPA.

- 1 (t) "NFPA 1124" means the "Code for the Manufacture,
- 2 Transportation, Storage, and Retail Sales of Fireworks and
- 3 Pyrotechnic Articles", 2006 edition, developed by NFPA.
- 4 (u) "NFPA 1126" means the "Standard for the Use of
- 5 Pyrotechnics Before a Proximate Audience", 2011 edition, developed
- 6 by NFPA.
- 7 (v) "Novelties" means that term as defined under APA standard
- 8 87-1, 3.2, 3.2.1, 3.2.2, 3.2.3, 3.2.4, and 3.2.5 and all of the
- 9 following:
- 10 (i) Toy plastic or paper caps for toy pistols in sheets,
- 11 strips, rolls, or individual caps containing not more than .25 of a
- 12 grain of explosive content per cap, in packages labeled to indicate
- 13 the maximum explosive content per cap.
- 14 (ii) Toy pistols, toy cannons, toy canes, toy trick
- 15 noisemakers, and toy guns in which toy caps as described in
- 16 subparagraph (i) are used, that are constructed so that the hand
- 17 cannot come in contact with the cap when in place for the
- 18 explosion, and that are not designed to break apart or be separated
- 19 so as to form a missile by the explosion.
- 20 (iii) Flitter sparklers in paper tubes not exceeding 1/8 inch
- 21 in diameter.
- 22 (iv) Toy snakes not containing mercury, if packed in cardboard
- 23 boxes with not more than 12 pieces per box for retail sale and if
- 24 the manufacturer's name and the quantity contained in each box are
- 25 printed on the box; and toy smoke devices.
- 26 (w) "Permanent building or structure" is MEANS a building or
- 27 structure that is affixed to a foundation on a site that has fixed

- 1 utility connections and that is intended to remain on the site for
- 2 more than 180 consecutive calendar days.
- 3 (x) "Person" means an individual, agent, association,
- 4 charitable organization, company, limited liability company,
- 5 corporation, labor organization, legal representative, partnership,
- 6 unincorporated organization, or any other legal or commercial
- 7 entity.
- 8 (y) "Retailer" means a person who sells consumer fireworks or
- 9 low-impact fireworks for resale to an individual for ultimate use.
- 10 (z) "Retail location" means a facility listed under NFPA 1124,
- **11** 7.1.2.
- 12 (aa) "Rule" means that term as defined in section 7 of the
- administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.207,
- 14 that was promulgated by the department.
- 15 (bb) "Serious impairment of a body function" means that term
- 16 as defined in section 58c of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
- **17** 300, MCL 257.58c.
- 18 (cc) "Serious violation" means a violation of this act, an
- 19 order issued under this act, or a rule promulgated or adopted by
- 20 reference under this act for which a substantial probability exists
- 21 that death or serious impairment of a body function to a person
- 22 other than the violator may result unless the violator did not and
- 23 could not, with the exercise of reasonable diligence, know of the
- 24 presence of the violation.
- 25 (DD) "SKY LANTERN" MEANS AN UNMANNED, SELF-CONTAINED LUMINARY
- 26 DEVICE THAT USES A BALLOON TO BECOME AIRBORNE AND THAT WHILE
- 27 AIRBORNE HAS AN OPEN FLAME OR OTHER HEAT SOURCE.

- 1 (EE) (dd) "Special effects" means a combination of chemical
- 2 elements or chemical compounds capable of burning independently of
- 3 the oxygen of the atmosphere and designed and intended to produce
- 4 an audible, visual, mechanical, or thermal effect as an integral
- 5 part of a motion picture, radio, television, theatrical, or opera
- 6 production or live entertainment.
- 7 (FF) (ee) "State fire marshal" means the state fire marshal
- 8 appointed under section 1b of the fire prevention code, 1941 PA
- 9 207, MCL 29.1b.
- 10 (GG) (ff)—"Warehouse" means a permanent building or structure
- 11 used primarily for the storage of consumer fireworks or low-impact
- 12 fireworks.
- 13 (HH) (gg) "Wholesaler" means any person who sells consumer
- 14 fireworks or low-impact fireworks to a retailer or any other person
- 15 for resale. Wholesaler does not include a person who sells only
- 16 display fireworks or special effects.
- 17 Sec. 12. (1) A person shall not ignite, discharge, or use
- 18 consumer fireworks on public property, school property, church
- 19 property, or the property of another person without that
- 20 organization's or person's express permission to use those
- 21 fireworks on those premises. Except as otherwise provided in this
- 22 section, a person that violates this subsection is responsible for
- 23 a state civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of
- 24 not more than \$500.00.
- 25 (2) Consumer A PERSON SHALL NOT SELL CONSUMER fireworks shall
- 26 not be sold to a minor. A person that violates this subsection
- 27 shall be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$500.00, or,

- 1 for a second or subsequent violation of this subsection, a civil
- 2 fine of not more than \$1,000.00. In addition, the person's consumer
- 3 fireworks certificate shall be suspended for 90 days after the
- 4 civil fine is ordered for a second or subsequent violation. This
- 5 age requirement shall be verified THE SELLER SHALL VERIFY THE AGE
- 6 OF A PURCHASER by any of the following:
- 7 (a) An operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the
- 8 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923.
- 9 (b) An official state personal identification card issued
- 10 under 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291 to 28.300.
- 11 (c) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 12 personal identification card issued under the enhanced driver
- 13 license and enhanced official state personal identification card
- 14 act, 2008 PA 23, MCL 28.301 to 28.308.
- 15 (d) A military identification card.
- 16 (e) A passport.
- 17 (f) Any other bona fide photograph PHOTOGRAPHIC identification
- 18 that establishes the identity and age of the individual.
- 19 (3) An individual shall not discharge, ignite, or use consumer
- 20 fireworks or low-impact fireworks while under the influence of
- 21 alcoholic liquor, a controlled substance, or a combination of
- 22 alcoholic liquor and a controlled substance. As used in this
- 23 subsection:
- 24 (a) "Alcoholic liquor" means that term as defined in section
- 25 1d of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1d.
- 26 (b) "Controlled substance" means that term as defined in
- 27 section 8b of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.8b.

- 1 (4) An individual who violates the smoking prohibition under
- 2 NFPA 1124, 7.3.11.1 is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
- 3 imprisonment for not more than 1 year or a fine of not more than
- 4 \$1,000.00, or both.
- **5** (5) Signage stating the smoking prohibition described in
- 6 subsection (4) satisfies the requirements of NFPA 1124.
- 7 (6) A PERSON SHALL NOT SELL AT RETAIL, POSSESS, OR IGNITE A
- 8 SKY LANTERN OR RELEASE AN IGNITED SKY LANTERN.
- 9 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 10 after the date it is enacted into law.

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
