SENATE BILL No. 1192

December 14, 2016, Introduced by Senator ANANICH and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 399, entitled "Safe drinking water act,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 325.1002), as amended by 1998 PA 56, and by adding section 25.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

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- (A) "ASSET MANAGEMENT" MEANS MAINTAINING, UPGRADING, AND OPERATING PHYSICAL ASSETS COST-EFFECTIVELY AND ON AN ONGOING BASIS, BASED ON A CONTINUOUS PHYSICAL INVENTORY AND CONDITION ASSESSMENT.
- (B) (a)—"Bottled drinking water" means water that is ultimately sold, provided, or offered for human consumption in a closed container.
- (C) (b)—"Capacity assessment" means an evaluation of the technical, financial, and managerial capability of a community supply or nontransient noncommunity water supply to comply and

- 1 maintain compliance with all requirements of this act and the rules
- promulgated under this act.
- 3 (D) "CENTRAL DATA STORAGE AGENCY" MEANS THAT AGENCY OR OFFICE
- 4 CHOSEN BY THE DEPARTMENT WHERE THE ASSET MANAGER DATA COLLECTED ARE
- 5 STORED AND MAINTAINED.
- 6 (E) (c)—"Community supply" means a—1 OF THE FOLLOWING AS
- 7 IMPLIED BY THE CONTEXT:
- 8 (i) A public water supply that provides year-round service to
- 9 not fewer than 15 living units or which THAT regularly provides
- 10 year-round service to not fewer than 25 residents.
- 11 (ii) THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY DESCRIBED
- 12 IN SUBPARAGRAPH (i).
- (F) (d) "Contaminant" means a physical, chemical, biological,
- 14 or radiological substance or matter in water.
- 15 (G) "COUNCIL" MEANS THE WATER SUPPLY ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL
- 16 CREATED BY SECTION 25.
- 17 (H) (e) "Customer service connection" means the pipe between a
- 18 water main and customer site piping or A building plumbing system.
- 19 (I) (f) "Customer site piping" means an underground piping
- 20 system owned or controlled by the customer that conveys water from
- 21 the customer service connection to building plumbing systems and
- 22 other points of use on lands owned or controlled by the customer.
- 23 Customer site piping does not include any system that incorporates
- 24 treatment to protect public health.
- 25 (J) (g) "Department" means the department of environmental
- 26 quality or its authorized agent or representative.
- 27 (K) (h)—"Director" means the director of the department of

- 1 environmental quality or his or her authorized agent or
- 2 representative.
- 3 (1) (i) "Imminent hazard" means that in the judgment of the
- 4 director there is a violation, or a condition that may cause a
- 5 violation, of the state drinking water standards at a public water
- 6 supply requiring immediate action to prevent endangering the health
- 7 of people.
- 8 (M) (j) "Living unit" means a house, apartment, or other
- 9 domicile occupied or intended to be occupied on a day to day DAY-
- 10 TO-DAY basis by an individual, family group, or equivalent.
- 11 (N) "MULTIYEAR PROGRAM" MEANS A COMPILATION OF COMMUNITY
- 12 SUPPLY PROJECTS ANTICIPATED TO BE CONTRACTED FOR BY THE COMMUNITY
- 13 SUPPLY DURING A 3-YEAR PERIOD. THE MULTIYEAR PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE
- 14 A LISTING OF EACH PROJECT TO BE FUNDED IN WHOLE OR IN PART WITH
- 15 STATE OR FEDERAL FUNDS.
- 16 (O) (k) "Noncommunity supply" means a public water supply that
- 17 is not a community supply, but that has not less than 15 service
- 18 connections or that serves not fewer than 25 individuals on an
- 19 average daily basis for not less than 60 days per year.
- 20 (P) (1)—"Nontransient noncommunity water supply" means a
- 21 noncommunity public water supply that serves not fewer than 25 of
- 22 the same individuals on an average daily basis over 6 months per
- 23 year. This definition includes water supplies in places of
- 24 employment, schools, and day-care centers.
- 25 (Q) (m) "Person" means an individual, partnership,
- 26 copartnership, cooperative, firm, company, public or private
- 27 association or corporation, political subdivision, agency of the

- 1 THIS state, agency of the federal government, trust, estate, joint
- 2 structure company, or any other legal entity, or their ITS legal
- 3 representative, agent, or assigns.
- 4 (R) (n) "Plans and specifications" means drawings, data, and a
- 5 true description or representation of an entire waterworks system
- 6 or parts of the system as it exists or is to be constructed, and a
- 7 statement on how a waterworks system is to be operated.
- 8 (S) (O) "Political subdivision" means a city, village,
- 9 township, charter township, county, district, OR authority or A
- 10 portion or combination thereof. OF ANY OF THESE.
- 11 (T) (p) "Public water supply" means a waterworks system that
- 12 provides water for drinking or household purposes to persons other
- 13 than the supplier of the water, and does not include either of the
- 14 following:
- 15 (i) A waterworks system that supplies water to only 1 living
- **16** unit.
- 17 (ii) A waterworks system that consists solely of customer site
- 18 piping.
- 19 (U) (q) "State drinking water standards" means quality
- 20 standards setting limits for contaminant levels or establishing
- 21 treatment techniques to meet standards necessary to protect the
- 22 public health.
- 23 (V) (r) "Service connection" means a direct connection from a
- 24 distribution water main to a living unit or other site to provide
- 25 water for drinking or household purposes.
- 26 (W) (s)—"Source water assessment" means a state program to
- 27 delineate the boundaries of areas in the state from which 1 or more

- 1 public water supplies receive supplies of drinking water, to
- 2 identify contaminants regulated under this act for which monitoring
- 3 is required because the THIS state has determined they may present
- 4 a threat to public health, and, to the extent practical, to
- 5 determine the susceptibility of the public water supply in the
- 6 delineated area to these contaminants.
- 7 (X) (t) "Supplier of water" or "supplier" means a person who
- 8 THAT owns or operates a public water supply, and includes a water
- 9 hauler.
- 10 (Y) (u)—"Transient noncommunity water supply" means a
- 11 noncommunity supply that does not meet the definition of
- 12 nontransient noncommunity water supply.
- (Z) (v) "Water hauler" means a person engaged in bulk
- 14 vehicular transportation, of water to other than the water hauler's
- own household, which OF WATER THAT is intended for use or used for
- 16 drinking or household purposes. Excluded from this definition are
- 17 those persons WATER HAULER DOES NOT INCLUDE A PERSON providing
- 18 water solely for employee use.
- 19 (AA) (w)—"Water main" means a pipe owned or controlled by a
- 20 supplier that may convey CONVEYS water to a customer service
- 21 connection or to a fire hydrant.
- 22 (BB) (x) Waterworks system or "system means a system of
- 23 pipes and structures through which water is obtained and
- 24 distributed, including, but not limited to, wells and well
- 25 structures, intakes and cribs, pumping stations, treatment plants,
- 26 storage tanks, pipelines and appurtenances, or a combination
- 27 thereof, OF ANY OF THESE, actually used or intended for use for the

- 1 purpose of furnishing water for drinking or household purposes.
- 2 (CC) (y) "Year-round service" means the ability of a supplier
- 3 of water to provide drinking water on a continuous basis to a
- 4 living unit or facility.
- 5 SEC. 25. (1) THE WATER SUPPLY ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL IS
- 6 CREATED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.
- 7 (2) THE COUNCIL SHALL CONSIST ALL OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS,
- 8 WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE DIRECTOR AND ARE VOTING MEMBERS
- 9 UNLESS OTHERWISE INDICATED:
- 10 (A) TWO MEMBERS REPRESENTING THE DEPARTMENT.
- 11 (B) TWO MEMBERS REPRESENTING CITIES.
- 12 (C) TWO MEMBERS REPRESENTING COMMUNITY PLANNERS.
- 13 (D) ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING COMMUNITY SUPPLIES.
- 14 (E) ONE MEMBER FROM ACADEMIA WHO HAS KNOWLEDGE OF AND
- 15 EXPERIENCE WITH PUBLIC WATER SUPPLIES.
- 16 (F) ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING THE PUBLIC HEALTH SECTOR.
- 17 (G) ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING COUNTIES.
- 18 (H) ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING TOWNSHIPS.
- 19 (I) ONE NONVOTING MEMBER REPRESENTING THE CENTRAL DATA STORAGE
- 20 AGENCY.
- 21 (3) THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED TO THE COUNCIL SHALL BE
- 22 APPOINTED WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY
- 23 ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION. MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL SERVE FOR
- 24 TERMS OF 3 YEARS OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED, WHICHEVER IS
- 25 LATER, EXCEPT THAT OF THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED 3 SHALL SERVE FOR
- 26 1 YEAR AND 3 SHALL SERVE FOR 2 YEARS. AN INDIVIDUAL MAY BE
- 27 APPOINTED FOR SUCCESSIVE TERMS.

- 1 (4) IF A VACANCY OCCURS ON THE COUNCIL, THE DIRECTOR SHALL
- 2 MAKE AN APPOINTMENT FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM IN THE SAME MANNER AS
- 3 THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT. THE DIRECTOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER OF THE
- 4 COUNCIL FOR INCOMPETENCE, DERELICTION OF DUTY, MALFEASANCE,
- 5 MISFEASANCE, OR NONFEASANCE IN OFFICE, OR ANY OTHER GOOD CAUSE.
- 6 (5) THE FIRST MEETING OF THE COUNCIL SHALL BE CALLED BY THE
- 7 DIRECTOR. AT THE FIRST MEETING, THE COUNCIL SHALL ELECT FROM AMONG
- 8 ITS MEMBERS A CHAIRPERSON AND OTHER OFFICERS AS IT CONSIDERS
- 9 APPROPRIATE. AFTER THE FIRST MEETING, THE COUNCIL SHALL MEET AT
- 10 LEAST QUARTERLY, OR MORE FREQUENTLY AT THE CALL OF THE CHAIRPERSON
- 11 OR IF REQUESTED BY 4 OR MORE MEMBERS. A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF
- 12 THE COUNCIL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS AT
- 13 A MEETING OF THE COUNCIL. A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AND
- 14 SERVING ARE REQUIRED FOR OFFICIAL ACTION OF THE COUNCIL. THE
- 15 BUSINESS THAT THE COUNCIL MAY PERFORM SHALL BE CONDUCTED AT A
- 16 PUBLIC MEETING OF THE COUNCIL HELD IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN
- 17 MEETINGS ACT, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 TO 15.275.
- 18 (6) A WRITING PREPARED, OWNED, USED, IN THE POSSESSION OF, OR
- 19 RETAINED BY THE COUNCIL IN THE PERFORMANCE OF AN OFFICIAL FUNCTION
- 20 IS SUBJECT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA 442, MCL
- 21 15.231 TO 15.246.
- 22 (7) MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION,
- 23 EXCEPT THAT A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL REPRESENTING THE DEPARTMENT OR
- 24 THE CENTRAL DATA STORAGE AGENCY SHALL SERVE WITHOUT ADDITIONAL
- 25 COMPENSATION. MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR THEIR
- 26 ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR
- 27 OFFICIAL DUTIES AS MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL.

- 1 (8) THE COUNCIL SHALL ADVISE THE DEPARTMENT AND COMMUNITY
- 2 SUPPLIES ON A STATEWIDE ASSET MANAGEMENT STRATEGY FOR COMMUNITY
- 3 SUPPLIES AND THE PROCESSES AND TOOLS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE
- 4 STRATEGY.
- 5 (9) WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF ITS FIRST MEETING, THE
- 6 COUNCIL SHALL DEVELOP AND PRESENT TO THE DIRECTOR FOR APPROVAL
- 7 PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE NECESSARY FOR THE
- 8 ADMINISTRATION OF THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PROCESS. THE PROCEDURES AND
- 9 REQUIREMENTS SHALL, AT A MINIMUM, INCLUDE THE AREAS OF TRAINING,
- 10 DATA STORAGE AND COLLECTION, REPORTING, DEVELOPMENT OF A MULTIYEAR
- 11 PROGRAM, BUDGETING AND FUNDING, AND OTHER ISSUES RELATED TO ASSET
- 12 MANAGEMENT. ALL QUALITY CONTROL STANDARDS AND PROTOCOLS SHALL, AT A
- 13 MINIMUM, BE CONSISTENT WITH ANY EXISTING FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS AND
- 14 REGULATIONS AND EXISTING GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTING STANDARDS.
- 15 (10) THE COUNCIL MAY APPOINT A TECHNICAL ADVISORY PANEL WHOSE
- 16 MEMBERS ARE REPRESENTATIVES FROM ASSOCIATIONS INVOLVED IN THE
- 17 CONSTRUCTION OF COMMUNITY SUPPLIES. THE COUNCIL SHALL SELECT
- 18 MEMBERS TO THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY PANEL FROM NAMES SUBMITTED BY THE
- 19 ASSOCIATIONS. THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY PANEL MEMBERS SHALL BE
- 20 APPOINTED FOR TERMS OF 3 YEARS. THE COUNCIL SHALL ASSIGN RESEARCH
- 21 ISSUES AND PROJECTS TO THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY PANEL TO ASSIST IN
- 22 THE DEVELOPMENT OF STATEWIDE ASSET MANAGEMENT POLICIES. THE
- 23 TECHNICAL ADVISORY PANEL'S RECOMMENDATIONS ARE NOT BINDING ON THE
- 24 COUNCIL.
- 25 (11) EACH COMMUNITY SUPPLY SHALL ANNUALLY SUBMIT A REPORT TO
- 26 THE COUNCIL. THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE A MULTIYEAR PROGRAM DEVELOPED
- 27 THROUGH THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PROCESS AS DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION

- 1 (9). PROJECTS CONTAINED IN THE ANNUAL MULTIYEAR PROGRAM SHALL BE
- 2 CONSISTENT WITH THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PROCESS OF THE COMMUNITY
- 3 SUPPLY AND SHALL BE REPORTED CONSISTENT WITH CATEGORIES ESTABLISHED
- 4 BY THE COUNCIL.
- 5 (12) FUNDING NECESSARY TO SUPPORT THE ACTIVITIES DESCRIBED IN
- 6 THIS SECTION, INCLUDING FUNDING FOR COSTS INCURRED BY PUBLICLY
- 7 OWNED COMMUNITY SUPPLIES, SHALL BE PROVIDED BY AN ANNUAL
- 8 APPROPRIATION IN THE DEPARTMENT'S BUDGET.
- 9 (13) THE DEPARTMENT AND EACH COMMUNITY SUPPLY SHALL KEEP
- 10 ACCURATE AND UNIFORM RECORDS ON ALL WORK PERFORMED AND FUNDS
- 11 EXPENDED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, PURSUANT TO PROCEDURES
- 12 DEVELOPED BY THE COUNCIL. EACH COMMUNITY SUPPLY SHALL ANNUALLY
- 13 REPORT TO THE COUNCIL THE RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS OF FUNDS FOR
- 14 THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION AND OF ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS.
- 15 THE REPORT SHALL BE MADE IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE COUNCIL,
- 16 WHICH SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH ACCEPTED ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES. A
- 17 REPORT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE COMBINED WITH A REPORT UNDER
- 18 SUBSECTION (11).
- 19 (14) BY FEBRUARY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE STAFF ASSIGNED TO THE
- 20 COUNCIL UNDER SUBSECTION (15) SHALL SUBMIT TO THE DIRECTOR AND THE
- 21 LEGISLATURE A REPORT REGARDING THE RESULTS OF ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED
- 22 DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR AND THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS RELATED TO
- 23 THOSE ACTIVITIES. THE REPORT SHALL ALSO INCLUDE AN OVERVIEW OF THE
- 24 ACTIVITIES IDENTIFIED FOR THE SUCCEEDING YEAR.
- 25 (15) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE QUALIFIED ADMINISTRATIVE
- 26 STAFF TO THE COUNCIL.
- 27 (16) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DESIGNATE A CENTRAL DATA STORAGE

- 1 AGENCY WITHIN 45 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY
- 2 ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION.
- 3 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 4 after the date it is enacted into law.
