

HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR
SENATE BILL NO. 541

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending sections 16221, 16226, 16323, 16601, 16605, 16621, 16626, and 17031 (MCL 333.16221, 333.16226, 333.16323, 333.16601, 333.16605, 333.16621, 333.16626, and 333.17031), sections 16221 and 16226 as amended by 2017 PA 249, section 16323 as amended by 2014 PA 305, section 16605 as added by 2006 PA 429, section 16621 as amended by 2002 PA 590, section 16626 as added by 2012 PA 289, and section 17031 as amended by 2002 PA 643, and by adding sections 16651, 16652, 16653, 16654, 16655, 16656, 16657, 16658, 16659, and 20189a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 16221. Subject to section 16221b, the department shall
2 investigate any allegation that 1 or more of the grounds for

1 disciplinary subcommittee action under this section exist, and may
2 investigate activities related to the practice of a health
3 profession by a licensee, a registrant, or an applicant for
4 licensure or registration. The department may hold hearings,
5 administer oaths, and order the taking of relevant testimony. After
6 its investigation, the department shall provide a copy of the
7 administrative complaint to the appropriate disciplinary
8 subcommittee. The disciplinary subcommittee shall proceed under
9 section 16226 if it finds that 1 or more of the following grounds
10 exist:

11 (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this section,
12 a violation of general duty, consisting of negligence or failure to
13 exercise due care, including negligent delegation to or supervision
14 of employees or other individuals, whether or not injury results,
15 or any conduct, practice, or condition that impairs, or may impair,
16 the ability to safely and skillfully engage in the practice of the
17 health profession.

18 (b) Personal disqualifications, consisting of 1 or more of the
19 following:

20 (i) Incompetence.

21 (ii) Subject to sections 16165 to 16170a, substance use
22 disorder as defined in section 100d of the mental health code, 1974
23 PA 258, MCL 330.1100d.

24 (iii) Mental or physical inability reasonably related to and
25 adversely affecting the licensee's or registrant's ability to
26 practice in a safe and competent manner.

27 (iv) Declaration of mental incompetence by a court of

1 competent jurisdiction.

2 (v) Conviction of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for
3 a maximum term of 2 years; conviction of a misdemeanor involving
4 the illegal delivery, possession, or use of a controlled substance;
5 or conviction of any felony other than a felony listed or described
6 in another subparagraph of this subdivision. A certified copy of
7 the court record is conclusive evidence of the conviction.

8 (vi) Lack of good moral character.

9 (vii) Conviction of a criminal offense under section 520e or
10 520g of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.520e and
11 750.520g. A certified copy of the court record is conclusive
12 evidence of the conviction.

13 (viii) Conviction of a violation of section 492a of the
14 Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.492a. A certified copy of
15 the court record is conclusive evidence of the conviction.

16 (ix) Conviction of a misdemeanor or felony involving fraud in
17 obtaining or attempting to obtain fees related to the practice of a
18 health profession. A certified copy of the court record is
19 conclusive evidence of the conviction.

20 (x) Final adverse administrative action by a licensure,
21 registration, disciplinary, or certification board involving the
22 holder of, or an applicant for, a license or registration regulated
23 by another state or a territory of the United States, by the United
24 States military, by the federal government, or by another country.
25 A certified copy of the record of the board is conclusive evidence
26 of the final action.

27 (xi) Conviction of a misdemeanor that is reasonably related to

1 or that adversely affects the licensee's or registrant's ability to
2 practice in a safe and competent manner. A certified copy of the
3 court record is conclusive evidence of the conviction.

4 (xii) Conviction of a violation of section 430 of the Michigan
5 penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.430. A certified copy of the court
6 record is conclusive evidence of the conviction.

7 (xiii) Conviction of a criminal offense under section 83, 84,
8 316, 317, 321, 520b, 520c, 520d, or 520f of the Michigan penal
9 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.83, 750.84, 750.316, 750.317, 750.321,
10 750.520b, 750.520c, 750.520d, and 750.520f. A certified copy of the
11 court record is conclusive evidence of the conviction.

12 (xiv) Conviction of a violation of section 136 or 136a of the
13 Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.136 and 750.136a. A
14 certified copy of the court record is conclusive evidence of the
15 conviction.

16 (c) Prohibited acts, consisting of 1 or more of the following:

17 (i) Fraud or deceit in obtaining or renewing a license or
18 registration.

19 (ii) Permitting a license or registration to be used by an
20 unauthorized person.

21 (iii) Practice outside the scope of a license.

22 (iv) Obtaining, possessing, or attempting to obtain or possess
23 a controlled substance as defined in section 7104 or a drug as
24 defined in section 7105 without lawful authority; or selling,
25 prescribing, giving away, or administering drugs for other than
26 lawful diagnostic or therapeutic purposes.

27 (d) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this section,

1 unethical business practices, consisting of 1 or more of the
2 following:

3 (i) False or misleading advertising.

4 (ii) Dividing fees for referral of patients or accepting
5 kickbacks on medical or surgical services, appliances, or
6 medications purchased by or in behalf of patients.

7 (iii) Fraud or deceit in obtaining or attempting to obtain
8 third party reimbursement.

9 (e) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this section,
10 unprofessional conduct, consisting of 1 or more of the following:

11 (i) Misrepresentation to a consumer or patient or in obtaining
12 or attempting to obtain third party reimbursement in the course of
13 professional practice.

14 (ii) Betrayal of a professional confidence.

15 (iii) Promotion for personal gain of an unnecessary drug,
16 device, treatment, procedure, or service.

17 (iv) Either of the following:

18 (A) A requirement by a licensee other than a physician or a
19 registrant that an individual purchase or secure a drug, device,
20 treatment, procedure, or service from another person, place,
21 facility, or business in which the licensee or registrant has a
22 financial interest.

23 (B) A referral by a physician for a designated health service
24 that violates 42 USC 1395nn or a regulation promulgated under that
25 section. For purposes of this subdivision, 42 USC 1395nn and the
26 regulations promulgated under that section as they exist on June 3,
27 2002 are incorporated by reference. A disciplinary subcommittee

1 shall apply 42 USC 1395nn and the regulations promulgated under
2 that section regardless of the source of payment for the designated
3 health service referred and rendered. If 42 USC 1395nn or a
4 regulation promulgated under that section is revised after June 3,
5 2002, the department shall officially take notice of the revision.
6 Within 30 days after taking notice of the revision, the department
7 shall decide whether or not the revision pertains to referral by
8 physicians for designated health services and continues to protect
9 the public from inappropriate referrals by physicians. If the
10 department decides that the revision does both of those things, the
11 department may promulgate rules to incorporate the revision by
12 reference. If the department does promulgate rules to incorporate
13 the revision by reference, the department shall not make any
14 changes to the revision. As used in this sub-subparagraph,
15 "designated health service" means that term as defined in 42 USC
16 1395nn and the regulations promulgated under that section and
17 "physician" means that term as defined in sections 17001 and 17501.

18 (v) For a physician who makes referrals under 42 USC 1395nn or
19 a regulation promulgated under that section, refusing to accept a
20 reasonable proportion of patients eligible for Medicaid and
21 refusing to accept payment from Medicaid or Medicare as payment in
22 full for a treatment, procedure, or service for which the physician
23 refers the individual and in which the physician has a financial
24 interest. A physician who owns all or part of a facility in which
25 he or she provides surgical services is not subject to this
26 subparagraph if a referred surgical procedure he or she performs in
27 the facility is not reimbursed at a minimum of the appropriate

1 Medicaid or Medicare outpatient fee schedule, including the
2 combined technical and professional components.

3 (vi) Any conduct by a health professional with a patient while
4 he or she is acting within the health profession for which he or
5 she is licensed or registered, including conduct initiated by a
6 patient or to which the patient consents, that is sexual or may
7 reasonably be interpreted as sexual, including, but not limited to,
8 sexual intercourse, kissing in a sexual manner, or touching of a
9 body part for any purpose other than appropriate examination,
10 treatment, or comfort.

11 (vii) Offering to provide practice-related services, such as
12 drugs, in exchange for sexual favors.

13 **(viii) A VIOLATION OF SECTION 16655(4) BY A DENTAL THERAPIST.**

14 (f) Failure to notify under section 16222(3) or (4).

15 (g) Failure to report a change of name or mailing address as
16 required in section 16192.

17 (h) A violation, or aiding or abetting in a violation, of this
18 article or of a rule promulgated under this article.

19 (i) Failure to comply with a subpoena issued pursuant to this
20 part, failure to respond to a complaint issued under this article,
21 article 7, or article 8, failure to appear at a compliance
22 conference or an administrative hearing, or failure to report under
23 section 16222(1) or 16223.

24 (j) Failure to pay an installment of an assessment levied
25 under the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.100 to
26 500.8302, within 60 days after notice by the appropriate board.

27 (k) A violation of section 17013 or 17513.

- 1 (l) Failure to meet 1 or more of the requirements for
2 licensure or registration under section 16174.
- 3 (m) A violation of section 17015, 17015a, 17017, 17515, or
4 17517.
- 5 (n) A violation of section 17016 or 17516.
- 6 (o) Failure to comply with section 9206(3).
- 7 (p) A violation of section 5654 or 5655.
- 8 (q) A violation of section 16274.
- 9 (r) A violation of section 17020 or 17520.
- 10 (s) A violation of the medical records access act, 2004 PA 47,
11 MCL 333.26261 to 333.26271.
- 12 (t) A violation of section 17764(2).

14 described in section 17047(2)(a) or (b), 17547(2)(a) or (b), or
15 18047(2)(a) or (b).
- 16 (v) A violation of section 7303a(2).
- 17 (w) A violation of section 7303a(4) or (5).
- 18 (x) A violation of section 7303b.
- 19 Sec. 16226. (1) After finding the existence of 1 or more of
20 the grounds for disciplinary subcommittee action listed in section
21 16221, a disciplinary subcommittee shall impose 1 or more of the
22 following sanctions for each violation:

1 (2) Determination of sanctions for violations under this
2 section shall be made by a disciplinary subcommittee. If, during
3 judicial review, the court of appeals determines that a final
4 decision or order of a disciplinary subcommittee prejudices
5 substantial rights of the petitioner for 1 or more of the grounds
6 listed in section 106 of the administrative procedures act of 1969,
7 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.306, and holds that the final decision or order
8 is unlawful and is to be set aside, the court shall state on the
9 record the reasons for the holding and may remand the case to the
10 disciplinary subcommittee for further consideration.

11 (3) A disciplinary subcommittee may impose a fine in an amount
12 that does not exceed \$250,000.00 for a violation of section
13 16221(a) or (b). A disciplinary subcommittee shall impose a fine of
14 at least \$25,000.00 if the violation of section 16221(a) or (b)
15 results in the death of 1 or more patients.

16 (4) A disciplinary subcommittee may require a licensee or
17 registrant or an applicant for licensure or registration who has
18 violated this article, article 7, or article 8 or a rule
19 promulgated under this article, article 7, or article 8 to
20 satisfactorily complete an educational program, a training program,
21 or a treatment program, a mental, physical, or professional
22 competence examination, or a combination of those programs and
23 examinations.

24 (5) A disciplinary subcommittee shall impose the sanction of
25 permanent revocation for a violation of section 16221(b) (xiii) if
26 the violation occurred while the licensee or registrant was acting
27 within the health profession for which he or she was licensed or

1 registered.

2 (6) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) and this
3 subsection, a disciplinary subcommittee shall not impose the
4 sanction of permanent revocation under this section without a
5 finding that the licensee or registrant engaged in a pattern of
6 intentional acts of fraud or deceit resulting in personal financial
7 gain to the licensee or registrant and harm to the health of
8 patients under the licensee's or registrant's care. This subsection
9 does not apply if a disciplinary subcommittee finds that a licensee
10 or registrant has violated section 16221(b) (xiv).

27 (2) The department shall waive the application processing and

1 license fees required under subsection (1) for an initial license
 2 to engage in practice as a dental assistant if the applicant for
 3 initial licensure, while on active duty as a member of the armed
 4 forces, served as a military dental specialist and was separated
 5 from service with an honorable character of service or under
 6 honorable conditions (general) character of service in the armed
 7 forces. The applicant shall provide a form DD214, DD215, or any
 8 other form that is satisfactory to the department to be eligible
 9 for the waiver of fees under this subsection. As used in this

15 Sec. 16601. (1) As used in this part:

16 (a) "Assignment" means that a dentist has designated a patient
 17 of record ~~upon~~ **ON** whom services are to be performed and has
 18 described the procedures to be performed. The dentist need not be
 19 physically present in the office or in the treatment room at the
 20 time the procedures are being performed.

21 (b) "Dental laboratory" means a dental workroom **THAT IS**
 22 operated as a part of a dental office or otherwise, by a person,
 23 other than a dentist, who is engaged in, or holds himself, herself,
 24 or itself out as being directly or indirectly engaged in,
 25 constructing, repairing, or altering prosthetic dentures, bridges,
 26 orthodontic or other appliances, or structures to be used as
 27 substitutes for or as a part of human teeth or jaws or associated

1 structures, or for the correction of malocclusions or deformities.

2 (c) "Dentist" means an individual **WHO IS** licensed under this
3 article to engage in the practice of dentistry.

4 (d) "Practice of dentistry" means the diagnosis, treatment,
5 prescription, or operation for a disease, pain, deformity,
6 deficiency, injury, or physical condition of the human tooth,
7 teeth, alveolar process, gums or jaws, or their dependent tissues,
8 or an offer, undertaking, attempt to do, or holding oneself out as
9 able to do any of these acts.

10 (e) "Practice as a dental assistant" means assistance in the
11 clinical practice of dentistry based on formal education,
12 specialized knowledge, and skill at the assignment and under the
13 supervision of a dentist.

14 (f) "Practice as a dental hygienist" means practice at the
15 assignment of a dentist in that specific area of dentistry based on
16 specialized knowledge, formal education, and skill with particular
17 emphasis on preventive services and oral health education.

18 **(G) "PRACTICE AS A DENTAL THERAPIST" MEANS PROVIDING ANY OF**
19 **THE CARE AND SERVICES, AND PERFORMING ANY OF THE DUTIES, DESCRIBED**
20 **IN SECTION 16656.**

21 (2) In addition, article 1 contains general definitions and
22 principles of construction applicable to all articles in this code
23 and part 161 contains definitions applicable to this part.

24 Sec. 16605. The following words, titles, or letters, or a
25 combination thereof, ~~OF ANY OF THOSE WORDS, TITLES, OR LETTERS,~~
26 with or without qualifying words or phrases, are restricted in use
27 only to those ~~persons~~ **INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE** authorized under this

1 part to use the following terms and in a way prescribed in this
 2 part: "dentist", "doctor of dental surgery", "oral and
 3 maxillofacial surgeon", "orthodontist", "prosthodontist",
 4 "periodontist", "endodontist", "oral pathologist", "pediatric
 5 dentist", "dental hygienist", "registered dental hygienist",
 6 "dental assistant", "registered dental assistant", "**DENTAL**

8 Sec. 16621. (1) The Michigan board of dentistry is created in
 9 the department. Subject to subsection (2), the board consists of
 10 the following ~~19-20~~ voting members, ~~who~~ **EACH OF WHOM MUST** meet the
 11 requirements of part 161:

12 (a) ~~Eight~~ **NINE** dentists. Subject to subsection ~~(3)~~, **(4)**, 1 or
 13 more of the dentists appointed under this subdivision may have a
 14 health profession specialty certification issued under section
 15 16608.

16 (b) Subject to subsection ~~(3)~~, **(4)**, 2 dentists who have been
 17 issued a health profession specialty certification under section
 18 16608.

 27 **VOTING MEMBERS ON THE BOARD TO 21. THE DENTAL THERAPISTS APPOINTED**

2 (3) The board meeting dates and times ~~shall~~**MUST** be concurred
3 in by a vote of not less than 13 board members.

11 Sec. 16626. (1) Subject to subsection (2), and notwithstanding
12 section 16601(1)(f) or the rules promulgated under section
13 16625(1), a dental hygienist **OR DENTAL THERAPIST** may utilize a
14 dental assistant to act as his or her second pair of hands.

15 (2) Notwithstanding section 16601(1)(e) or the rules
16 promulgated under section 16625(1), a dental assistant may function
17 as a second pair of hands for a dentist, ~~or~~dental hygienist, **OR**
18 **DENTAL THERAPIST** if all of the following are met:

19 (a) The dentist, ~~or~~dental hygienist, **OR DENTAL THERAPIST** is
20 actively performing services in the mouth of a patient at the time
21 the dental assistant is assisting him or her.

22 (b) If the dental assistant is assisting a dental hygienist, a
23 supervising dentist has assigned the dental assistant to act as the
24 dental hygienist's second pair of hands.

25 (3) This section does not require new or additional third
26 party reimbursement or mandated worker's compensation benefits for
27 services rendered by an individual **WHO IS** licensed as a dental

1 assistant, ~~or as a~~ dental hygienist, **OR DENTAL THERAPIST** under this
2 article.

3 (4) As used in this section, "second pair of hands" means that
4 term as defined in R 338.11101 of the Michigan administrative
5 ~~code~~. **ADMINISTRATIVE CODE.**

6 **SEC. 16651. (1) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS GRANTED A LICENSE UNDER**

7 Canada if, **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (4)**, the applicant
8 demonstrates to the board all of the following:

9 (a) That the applicant has engaged in the practice of medicine
10 for not less than 10 years after completing the requirements for a
11 degree in medicine.

12 (b) That the applicant has completed not less than 3 years of
13 postgraduate clinical training in an institution that has an
14 affiliation with a medical school that is listed in a directory of
15 medical schools published by the ~~world health organization~~ **WORLD**
16 **HEALTH ORGANIZATION** as approved by the board.

17 (c) That the applicant has achieved a score determined by the
18 board to be a passing score on an initial medical licensure
19 examination approved by the board.

20 (d) That the applicant has safely and competently practiced
21 medicine under a clinical academic limited license granted by the
22 board under this article for 1 or more academic institutions
23 located in this state for not less than the 2 years immediately
24 preceding the date of application for a license under this
25 subsection, during which time the applicant functioned not less
26 than 800 hours per year in the observation and treatment of
27 patients.

1 (3) An applicant ~~under subsection (2)~~ **WHO IS REQUIRED TO MEET**
2 **THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (2) (D)** shall file with the board a
3 written statement from each academic institution upon which the
4 applicant relies to satisfy **THAT** subsection. ~~(2)(d)~~. The statement
5 shall indicate, at a minimum, that the applicant functioned for the
6 academic institution in the observation and treatment of patients
7 not less than 800 hours per year and that in so doing the applicant
8 practiced medicine safely and competently. A person who in good
