

SENATE BILL No. 366

May 4, 2017, Introduced by Senators SCHMIDT, COLBECK, HORN, PROOS, MACGREGOR, SHIRKEY, GREEN, CASPERSON and STAMAS and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

by amending sections 5b, 5c, and 5l (MCL 28.425b, 28.425c, and 28.425l), section 5b as amended by 2015 PA 207 and sections 5c and 5l as amended by 2015 PA 3.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 ~~concealed weapon licensing board in the county in which that~~
2 ~~individual resides. Beginning December 1, 2015, to~~ **TO** obtain a
3 license to carry a concealed pistol, an individual shall apply to
4 the county clerk in the county in which the individual resides. The
5 applicant shall file the application with the county clerk in the
6 county in which the applicant resides during the county clerk's
7 normal business hours. The application ~~shall~~ **MUST** be on a form
8 provided by the director of the department of state police. ~~Until~~
9 ~~November 30, 2015, the application shall allow the applicant to~~
10 ~~designate whether the applicant seeks a temporary license.~~
11 ~~Beginning December 1, 2015, the application shall~~ **AND** allow the
12 applicant to designate whether the applicant seeks an emergency
13 license **OR A PROVISIONAL LICENSE**. The **APPLICANT SHALL SIGN THE**
14 ~~application shall be signed under oath. by the applicant. The~~
15 **COUNTY CLERK OR HIS OR HER REPRESENTATIVE SHALL ADMINISTER THE**
16 ~~oath. shall be administered by the county clerk or his or her~~
17 ~~representative. Beginning December 1, 2015, not~~ **AN APPLICANT SHALL**
18 **NOT SUBMIT** more than 1 application ~~may be submitted~~ under this
19 subsection in any calendar year. ~~Beginning December 1, 2015, an~~ **AN**
20 application under this subsection is not considered complete until
21 an applicant submits all of the required information and fees and
22 has fingerprints taken under subsection (9). ~~Beginning December 1,~~
23 ~~2015, an~~ **AN** application under this subsection is considered
24 withdrawn if an applicant does not have fingerprints taken under
25 subsection (9) within 45 days of the date an application is filed
26 under this subsection. ~~Beginning December 1, 2015, a~~ **A** completed
27 application under this section expires 1 year from the date of

1 application. ~~Beginning December 1, 2015, the~~ **THE** county clerk shall
2 issue the applicant a receipt for his or her application at the
3 time the application is submitted containing the name of the
4 applicant, the applicant's state-issued driver license or personal
5 identification card number, the date and time the receipt is
6 issued, the amount paid, the name of the county in which the
7 receipt is issued, an impression of the county seal, and the
8 statement, "This receipt was issued for the purpose of applying for
9 a concealed pistol license and for obtaining fingerprints related
10 to that application. This receipt does not authorize an individual
11 to carry a concealed pistol in this state.". The application ~~shall~~
12 **MUST** contain all of the following:

13 (a) The applicant's legal name, date of birth, the address of
14 his or her primary residence, and ~~, beginning December 1, 2015,~~ his
15 or her state-issued driver license or personal identification card
16 number. ~~Until November 30, 2015, if the applicant resides in a~~
17 ~~city, village, or township that has a police department, the name~~
18 ~~of the police department.~~

19 (b) A statement by the applicant that the applicant meets the
20 criteria for a license under this act to carry a concealed pistol.

21 (c) ~~Until November 30, 2015, a statement by the applicant~~
22 ~~authorizing the concealed weapon licensing board to access any~~
23 ~~record, including any medical record, pertaining to the applicant's~~
24 ~~qualifications for a license to carry a concealed pistol under this~~
25 ~~act. The applicant may request that information received by the~~
26 ~~concealed weapon licensing board under this subdivision be reviewed~~
27 ~~in a closed session. If the applicant requests that the session be~~

1 ~~closed, the concealed weapon licensing board shall close the~~
2 ~~session only for purposes of this subdivision. The applicant and~~
3 ~~his or her representative have the right to be present in the~~
4 ~~closed session. Beginning December 1, 2015, a~~ **A** statement by the
5 applicant authorizing the department of state police to access any
6 record needed to perform the verification in subsection (6).

7 (d) A statement by the applicant regarding whether he or she
8 has a history of mental illness that would disqualify him or her
9 under subsection (7)(j) to (l) from receiving a license to carry a
10 concealed pistol.

11 (e) A statement by the applicant regarding whether he or she
12 has ever been convicted in this state or elsewhere for any of the
13 following:

14 (i) Any felony.

15 (ii) A misdemeanor listed under subsection (7)(h) if the
16 applicant was convicted of that misdemeanor in the 8 years
17 immediately preceding the date of the application, or a misdemeanor
18 listed under subsection (7)(i) if the applicant was convicted of
19 that misdemeanor in the 3 years immediately preceding the date of
20 the application.

21 (f) A statement by the applicant whether he or she has been
22 dishonorably discharged from the United States ~~armed forces.~~ **ARMED**
23 **FORCES.**

24 ~~— (g) Until November 30, 2015, if the applicant seeks a~~
25 ~~temporary license, the facts supporting the issuance of that~~
26 ~~temporary license.~~

27 ~~— (h) Until November 30, 2015, the names, residential addresses,~~

1 ~~and telephone numbers of 2 individuals who are references for the~~
2 ~~applicant.~~

3 (G) ~~(i) Until November 30, 2015, a passport quality photograph~~
4 ~~of the applicant provided by the applicant at the time of~~
5 ~~application. Beginning December 1, 2015, if **IF** an applicant does~~
6 not have a digitized photograph on file with the secretary of
7 state, a passport-quality photograph of the applicant provided by
8 the applicant at the time of application.

9 (H) ~~(j)~~A certificate stating that the applicant has completed
10 the training course prescribed by this act.

11 (2) The county clerk shall not require the applicant to submit
12 any additional forms, documents, letters, or other evidence of
13 eligibility for obtaining a license to carry a concealed pistol
14 except as set forth in subsection (1) or as otherwise provided for
15 in this act. The application form ~~shall~~**MUST** contain a conspicuous
16 warning that the application is executed under oath and that
17 intentionally making a material false statement on the application
18 is a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or
19 a fine of not more than \$2,500.00, or both.

20 (3) An individual who intentionally makes a material false
21 statement on an application under subsection (1) is guilty of a
22 felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a
23 fine of not more than \$2,500.00, or both.

24 (4) The county clerk shall retain a copy of each application
25 for a license to carry a concealed pistol as an official record.
26 One year after the expiration of a concealed pistol license, the
27 county clerk may destroy the record and maintain only a name index

1 of the record.

2 (5) ~~Until November 30, 2015, each applicant shall pay a~~
3 ~~nonrefundable application and licensing fee of \$105.00 by any~~
4 ~~method of payment accepted by that county for payments of other~~
5 ~~fees and penalties. Beginning December 1, 2015, each **EACH** applicant~~
6 shall pay an application and licensing fee of \$100.00 by any method
7 of payment accepted by that county for payments of other fees and
8 penalties. Except as provided in subsection (9), no other charge,
9 fee, cost, or assessment, including any local charge, fee, cost, or
10 assessment, is required of the applicant except as specifically
11 authorized in this act. The **APPLICANT SHALL PAY THE** application and
12 licensing fee ~~shall be payable to the county. Until November 30,~~
13 ~~2015, the county treasurer shall deposit \$15.00 of each application~~
14 ~~and licensing fee collected under this section in the general fund~~
15 ~~of the county and credit that deposit to the credit of the county~~

22 forward the balance remaining to the state treasurer. The state
23 treasurer shall deposit the balance of the fee in the general fund
24 to the credit of the department of state police. The department of
25 state police shall use the money received under this act to process
26 the fingerprints and to reimburse the Federal Bureau of
27 Investigation for the costs associated with processing fingerprints

3 (6) ~~Until November 30, 2015, the county sheriff on behalf of~~
4 ~~the concealed weapon licensing board shall verify the requirements~~

6 ~~through the law enforcement information network and report his or~~
7 ~~her finding to the concealed weapon licensing board. Beginning~~
8 ~~December 1, 2015, the~~ **THE** department of state police shall verify

26 (7) ~~Until November 30, 2015, the concealed weapon licensing~~
27 ~~board and, beginning December 1, 2015, the~~ **THE** county clerk shall

1 issue and shall send by first-class mail a license to an applicant
2 to carry a concealed pistol within the period required under this
3 act if the ~~concealed weapon licensing board or county clerk~~
4 determines that all of the following circumstances exist:

5 (a) The applicant is 21 years of age or older, **OR IF THE**
6 **APPLICANT IS APPLYING FOR A PROVISIONAL LICENSE, THE APPLICANT IS**
7 **AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD BUT LESS THAN 21 YEARS OLD.**

16 ~~applicant or the safety of a member of the applicant's family is~~
17 ~~endangered by the applicant's inability to immediately obtain a~~
18 ~~license to carry a concealed pistol. Until November 30, 2015, if~~
19 ~~the applicant holds a valid concealed pistol license issued by~~
20 ~~another state at the time the applicant's residency in this state~~
21 ~~is established, the concealed weapon licensing board may waive the~~
22 ~~6 month waiting period and the applicant may apply for a concealed~~
23 ~~pistol license at the time the applicant's residency in this state~~
24 ~~is established. Until November 30, 2015, the concealed weapon~~
25 ~~licensing board shall immediately issue a temporary license to that~~
26 ~~applicant. Until November 30, 2015, the temporary license is valid~~
27 ~~until the concealed weapon licensing board decides whether to grant~~

1 ~~or deny the application. Beginning December 1, 2015, the~~ **THE** county
2 clerk shall waive the 6-month residency requirement for an
3 emergency license under section 5a(4) if the applicant is a
4 petitioner for a personal protection order issued under section
5 2950 or 2950a of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236,
6 MCL 600.2950 and 600.2950a, or if the county sheriff determines
7 that there is clear and convincing evidence to believe that the
8 safety of the applicant or the safety of a member of the
9 applicant's family or household is endangered by the applicant's
10 inability to immediately obtain a license to carry a concealed
11 pistol. ~~Beginning December 1, 2015, if~~ **IF** the applicant holds a
12 valid concealed pistol license issued by another state at the time
13 the applicant's residency in this state is established, the county
14 clerk shall waive the 6-month ~~waiting period~~ **RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT**
15 and the applicant may apply for a concealed pistol license at the
16 time the applicant's residency in this state is established. For
17 the purposes of this section, ~~a person~~ **AN INDIVIDUAL** is considered
18 a legal resident of this state if any of the following apply:

19 (i) The ~~person~~ **INDIVIDUAL** has a valid, lawfully obtained
20 driver license issued under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300,
21 MCL 257.1 to 257.923, or official state personal identification
22 card issued under 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291 to 28.300.

23 (ii) The ~~person~~ **INDIVIDUAL** is lawfully registered to vote in
24 this state.

25 (iii) The ~~person~~ **INDIVIDUAL** is on active duty status with the
26 United States ~~armed forces~~ **ARMED FORCES** and is stationed outside of
27 this state, but the ~~person's~~ **INDIVIDUAL'S** home of record is in this

1 state.

2 (iv) The ~~person~~**INDIVIDUAL** is on active duty status with the
3 United States ~~armed forces~~**ARMED FORCES** and is permanently
4 stationed in this state, but the ~~person's~~**INDIVIDUAL'S** home of
5 record is in another state.

6 (c) The applicant has knowledge and has had training in the
7 safe use and handling of a pistol by the successful completion of a
8 pistol safety training course or class that meets the requirements
9 of section 5j.

10 (d) The applicant is not the subject of an order or
11 disposition under any of the following:

12 (i) Section 464a of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL
13 330.1464a.

14 (ii) Section 5107 of the estates and protected individuals
15 code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5107.

16 (iii) Sections 2950 and 2950a of the revised judicature act of
17 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950 and 600.2950a.

18 (iv) Section 6b of chapter V of the code of criminal
19 procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 765.6b, if the order has a condition
20 imposed under section 6b(3) of chapter V of the code of criminal
21 procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 765.6b.

22 (v) Section 16b of chapter IX of the code of criminal
23 procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 769.16b.

24 (e) The applicant is not prohibited from possessing, using,
25 transporting, selling, purchasing, carrying, shipping, receiving,
26 or distributing a firearm under section 224f of the Michigan penal
27 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.224f.

1 (f) The applicant has never been convicted of a felony in this
2 state or elsewhere, and a felony charge against the applicant is
3 not pending in this state or elsewhere at the time he or she
4 applies for a license described in this section.

5 (g) The applicant has not been dishonorably discharged from
6 the United States ~~armed forces~~. **ARMED FORCES**.

7 (h) The applicant has not been convicted of a misdemeanor
8 violation of any of the following in the 8 years immediately
9 preceding the date of application and a charge for a misdemeanor
10 violation of any of the following is not pending against the
11 applicant in this state or elsewhere at the time he or she applies
12 for a license described in this section:

13 (i) Section 617a (failing to stop when involved in a personal
14 injury accident), section 625 as punishable under subsection (9)(b)
15 of that section (operating while intoxicated, second offense),
16 section 625m as punishable under subsection (4) of that section
17 (operating a commercial vehicle with alcohol content, second
18 offense), section 626 (reckless driving), or a violation of section
19 904(1) (operating while license suspended or revoked, second or
20 subsequent offense) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL
21 257.617a, 257.625, 257.625m, 257.626, and 257.904.

22 (ii) Section 185(7) of the aeronautics code of the state of

9 (xii) A violation of a law of the United States, another
10 state, or a local unit of government of this state or another state
11 substantially corresponding to a violation described in
12 subparagraphs (i) to (xi).

13 (i) The applicant has not been convicted of a misdemeanor
14 violation of any of the following in the 3 years immediately
15 preceding the date of application unless the misdemeanor violation
16 is listed under subdivision (h) and a charge for a misdemeanor
17 violation of any of the following is not pending against the
18 applicant in this state or elsewhere at the time he or she applies
19 for a license described in this section:

20 (i) Section 625 (operating under the influence), section 625a
21 (refusal of commercial vehicle operator to submit to a chemical
22 test), section 625k (ignition interlock device reporting
23 violation), section 625l (circumventing an ignition interlock
24 device), or section 625m punishable under subsection (3) of that
25 section (operating a commercial vehicle with alcohol content) of
26 the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.625, 257.625a,
27 257.625k, 257.625l, and 257.625m.

1 (ii) Section 185 of the aeronautics code of the state of
2 Michigan, 1945 PA 327, MCL 259.185 (operating aircraft under the
3 influence).

4 (iii) Section 81134 (operating ORV under the influence or
5 operating ORV while visibly impaired), or section 82127 (operating

17 fraud), section 359 (larceny from a vacant building or structure),
18 section 362 (larceny by conversion), section 362a (larceny -
19 defrauding lessor), section 377a (malicious destruction of
20 property), section 380 (malicious destruction of real property),
21 section 535 (receiving or concealing stolen property), or section

3 (j) The applicant has not been found guilty but mentally ill
4 of any crime and has not offered a plea of not guilty of, or been
5 acquitted of, any crime by reason of insanity.

6 (k) The applicant is not currently and has never been subject
7 to an order of involuntary commitment in an inpatient or outpatient
8 setting due to mental illness.

9 (l) The applicant has filed a statement under subsection
10 (1)(d) that the applicant does not have a diagnosis of mental
11 illness that includes an assessment that the individual presents a
12 danger to himself or herself or to another at the time the
13 application is made, regardless of whether he or she is receiving
14 treatment for that illness.

15 (m) The applicant is not under a court order of legal
16 incapacity in this state or elsewhere.

17 (n) The applicant has a valid state-issued driver license or
18 personal identification card.

19 (8) Upon entry of a court order or conviction of 1 of the
20 enumerated prohibitions for using, transporting, selling,
21 purchasing, carrying, shipping, receiving, or distributing a
22 firearm in this section the department of state police shall
23 immediately enter the order or conviction into the law enforcement
24 information network. For purposes of this act, information of the
25 court order or conviction ~~shall~~**MUST** not be removed from the law
26 enforcement information network, but may be moved to a separate
