 14 for fiscal year ~~2018-2019,~~ **2019-2020**, except that the amounts will
 15 be adjusted for changes in retirement costs, caseload and related
 16 costs, federal fund match rates, economic factors, and available
 17 revenue. These adjustments will be determined after the January

22 Sec. 206. (1) The funds appropriated in section 201 are
 23 appropriated for community colleges with fiscal years ending June

 26 colleges in 11 monthly installments on the sixteenth of each month,
 27 or the next succeeding business day, beginning with October 16,
 28 ~~2018-2019~~. Each community college shall accrue its July and August

2 (2) If the state budget director determines that a community

22 (g) The state budget director shall notify the chairs of the
23 house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community colleges
24 at least 10 days before withholding funds from any community
25 college.

26 Sec. 207a. All of the following apply to the allocation of the
27 fiscal year ~~2018-2019-2019-2020~~ appropriations described in section
28 201(4):

29 (a) A community college that receives money under section



1 201(4) shall use that money solely for the purpose of offsetting a
2 portion of the retirement contributions owed by the college for
3 that fiscal year.

4 (b) The amount allocated to each participating community
5 college under section 201(4) shall be based on each college's
6 percentage of the total covered payroll for all community colleges
7 that are participating colleges in the immediately preceding fiscal
8 year.

9 Sec. 207b. All of the following apply to the allocation of the
10 fiscal year ~~2018-2019~~ **2019-2020** appropriations described in section
11 201(5) for payments to community colleges that are participating
12 entities of the retirement system:

13 (a) The amount of a payment under section 201(5) shall be the
14 difference between the unfunded actuarial accrued liability
15 contribution rate as calculated under section 41 of the public
16 school employees retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1341,
17 as calculated without taking into account the maximum employer rate
18 of 20.96% included in section 41 of the public school employees
19 retirement act of 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1341, and the maximum
20 employer rate of 20.96% under section 41 of the public school

22 (b) The amount allocated to each community college under
23 section 201(5) shall be based on each community college's
24 percentage of the total covered payroll for all community colleges

26 year. A community college that receives funds under this
27 subdivision shall use the funds solely for the purpose of
28 retirement contributions under section 201(5).

29 (c) Each participating college that receives funds under



1 section 201(5) shall forward an amount equal to the amount
2 allocated under subdivision (b) to the retirement system in a form
3 and manner determined by the retirement system.

4 Sec. 207c. All of the following apply to the allocation of the
5 appropriations described in section 201(6) to community colleges
6 described in section 12(3) of the Michigan renaissance zone act,
7 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692:

8 (a) The amount allocated to each community college under
9 section 201(6) for fiscal year ~~2018-2019~~ **2019-2020** shall be based
10 on that community college's proportion of total revenue lost by
11 community colleges as a result of the exemption of property taxes
12 levied in ~~2018-2019~~ under the Michigan renaissance zone act, 1996
13 PA 376, MCL 125.2681 to 125.2696.

14 (b) The appropriations described in section 201(6) shall be
15 made to each eligible community college within 60 days after the
16 department of treasury certifies to the state budget director that
17 it has received all necessary information to properly determine the
18 amounts payable to each eligible community college under section 12
19 of the Michigan renaissance zone act, 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692.

20 Sec. 209. (1) Within 30 days after the board of a community
21 college adopts its annual operating budget for the following fiscal
22 year, or after the board adopts a subsequent revision to that
23 budget, the community college shall make all of the following
24 available through a link on its website homepage:

25 (a) The annual operating budget and subsequent budget
26 revisions.

27 (b) A link to the most recent "Michigan Community College Data
28 Inventory Report".

29 (c) General fund revenue and expenditure projections for the



1 current fiscal year and the next fiscal year.

2 (d) A listing of all debt service obligations, detailed by
3 project, anticipated payment of each project, and total outstanding
4 debt for the current fiscal year.

5 (e) Links to all of the following for the community college:

6 (i) The current collective bargaining agreement for each
7 bargaining unit.

8 (ii) Each health care benefits plan, including, but not limited
9 to, medical, dental, vision, disability, long-term care, or any
10 other type of benefits that would constitute health care services,
11 offered to any bargaining unit or employee of the community
12 college.

13 (iii) Audits and financial reports for the most recent fiscal
14 year for which they are available.

15 (iv) A copy of the board of trustees resolution regarding
16 compliance with best practices for the local strategic value
17 component described in section 230(2).

18 **(f) A map that includes the boundaries of the community
19 college district.**

20 (2) For statewide consistency and public visibility, community
21 colleges must use the icon badge provided by the department of
22 technology, management, and budget consistent with the icon badge
23 developed by the department of education for K-12 school districts.
24 It must appear on the front of each community college's homepage.
25 The size of the icon may be reduced to 150 x 150 pixels.

26 (3) The state budget director shall determine whether a
27 community college has complied with this section. The state budget
28 director may withhold a community college's monthly installments
29 described in section 206 until the community college complies with



1 this section. The state budget director shall notify the chairs of
 2 the house and senate appropriations subcommittee on community
 3 colleges at least 10 days before withholding funds from any
 4 community college.

5 (4) Each community college shall report the following
 6 information to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on
 7 community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the
 8 state budget office by November 15 of each fiscal year and post
 9 that information on its website as required under subsection (1):

10 (a) Budgeted current fiscal year general fund revenue from
 11 tuition and fees.

12 (b) Budgeted current fiscal year general fund revenue from
 13 state appropriations.

14 (c) Budgeted current fiscal year general fund revenue from
 15 property taxes.

16 (d) Budgeted current fiscal year total general fund revenue.

17 (e) Budgeted current fiscal year total general fund
 18 expenditures.

19 (5) By **the first business day of** November ~~15~~ of each year, a
 20 community college shall report the following information to the
 21 center and post the information on its website under the budget
 22 transparency icon badge:

23 (a) Opportunities for earning college credit through the
 24 following programs:

25 (i) State approved career and technical education or a tech
 26 prep articulated program of study.

27 (ii) Direct college credit or concurrent enrollment.

28 (iii) Dual enrollment.

29 (iv) An early college/middle college program.



1 (b) For each program described in subdivision (a) that the
2 community college offers, all of the following information:

3 (i) The number of high school students participating in the
4 program.

5 (ii) The number of school districts that participate in the
6 program with the community college.

7 (iii) Whether a college professor, qualified local school
8 district employee, or other individual teaches the course or
9 courses in the program.

10 (iv) The total cost to the community college to operate the
11 program.

12 (v) The cost per credit hour for the course or courses in the
13 program.

14 (vi) The location where the course or courses in the program
15 are held.

16 (vii) Instructional resources offered to the program
17 instructors.

18 (viii) Resources offered to the student in the program.

19 (ix) Transportation services provided to students in the
20 program.

21 Sec. 209a. (1) A public community college shall develop,
22 maintain, and update a "campus safety information and resources"
23 link, prominently displayed on the homepage of its website, to a
24 section of its website containing all of the information required
25 under subsection (2).

26 (2) The "campus safety information and resources" section of a
