2 (d) "Organized fire department" means that term as defined in
3 section 1 of the fire prevention code, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1.

4 (e) "PFAS" means a perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl
5 substance.

6 Sec. 14703. (1) Within 48 hours after an organized fire
7 department uses firefighting foam containing intentionally added
8 PFAS, the fire chief shall submit to the department of environment,
9 Great Lakes, and energy a written report that includes all of the
10 following information:

11 (a) The purpose for which the foam was used.

12 (b) The physical address and the latitude and longitude of the
13 location at which the foam was used.

14 (c) The quantity of foam concentrate used.

15 (d) The quantity of water used to produce the foam or used in
16 conjunction with the foam.

17 (e) The name brand and manufacturer of the foam concentrate.

18 (f) The name of any water body potentially affected by the
19 foam or firewater through surface water runoff, groundwater, or a
20 storm sewer or combined sewer, its distance and direction from the
21 location at which the foam was used, practices employed for
22 containment and proper disposal of the foam and firewater, and
23 whether the foam or firewater is known to have entered the water
24 body.

25 (g) Practices employed for cleanup and disposal of materials
26 contaminated by the foam concentrate, foam, or firewater.

27 (2) The department may prescribe the format of the report
28 under subsection (1) and the means by which the report shall be
29 submitted.



1 Sec. 14705. The department shall establish a collection
2 program for firefighting foam concentrate containing intentionally
3 added PFAS and establish guidelines for the program. Under the
4 program, the department shall accept the foam concentrate free of
5 charge and properly dispose of the foam concentrate. The program is
6 contingent on legislative appropriations to cover program costs.

7 Sec. 14707. A person that violates section 14703 may be
8 ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than \$500.00. A violation
9 of section 14703 may be prosecuted by the prosecutor of the county
10 in which the violation occurred or by the attorney general.
