A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

PART 2

PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

9 Sec. 201. In accordance with section 30 of article IX of the
10 state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources
11 in this appropriation act for the fiscal year ending September 30,
12 2020 is \$100,000.00 and state spending from state sources to be
13 paid to local units of government is \$100,000.00.

14 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
15 under this act and the departments, commissions, boards, offices,
16 and programs for which appropriations are made under this act are
17 subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
18 to 18.1594.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

21 Sec. 301. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for autism
22 train the trainer grant, the department shall appropriate
23 \$100,000.00 to implement a pilot project to train school employees
24 on the principles and practices of applied behavior analysis and
25 research-based intervention strategies. The pilot project must do
26 both of the following:

27 (a) Train paraprofessionals and teachers in a school district
28 with a headquarters located in a city with a population between
29 6,900 and 7,000 according to the most recent decennial census in

1 applied behavior analysis skills that match the national standard
2 for behavior technician-level work and research-based intervention
3 strategies.

4 (b) Train teacher consultants, school social workers, school
5 psychologists, and other school personnel responsible for
6 conducting functional behavioral assessments and the development of
7 behavior support plans in a school district with a headquarters
8 located in a city with a population between 6,900 and 7,000
9 according to the most recent federal decennial census on methods
10 for assuring implementation of a behavior plan with fidelity and
11 strategies for sharing understanding of evidence-based behavioral
12 health approaches with other school-based personnel.

13 (2) Outcomes and performance measures for the pilot project
14 funded under this section shall include, but not be limited to, the
15 following:

16 (a) A decrease in the number of center-program and self-
17 contained-classroom referrals.

18 (b) A decrease in the number of suspensions, removals, and
19 expulsions.

20 (c) A decrease in paraprofessional absences.

21 (d) An increase in teacher retention.

22 (e) An increase in safety.

23 (3) By September 1 of the current fiscal year, the department
24 shall report to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees
25 on the department budget, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the
26 senate and house policy offices, and the state budget office on the
27 information required in subsection (2).
