HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.263

Rep. Hammoud offered the following resolution:

1 A resolution to memorialize the President and Congress of the United States to take various actions to minimize the social and 2 economic impact of and improve response to the COVID-19 pandemic. 3

Whereas, COVID-19, also known as the novel coronavirus, has continued to spread throughout Michigan and the United States. The first cases in Michigan were reported on March 10, 2020, and the number of cases has continued to increase. On March 16, 2020, Dr.

Joneigh Khaldun, the state's chief medical officer, stated that 8

Whereas, Preventing the spread of COVID-19 and mitigating its 11 effects may require prolonged periods of isolation and 12 extraordinary public health measures. Governor Whitmer has issued 13





- 1 executive orders prohibiting large gatherings, closing all primary
- 2 and secondary schools, and requiring the closure of many
- 3 businesses, including restaurants and movie theaters. President
- 4 Trump has suggested that these measures may be necessary for
- 5 several months, and that all gatherings over 10 people be
- 6 cancelled; and
- 7 Whereas, Taking these necessary steps to protect public health
- 8 will place a heavy burden on residents in Michigan and across the
- 9 country. Many employees will be out of work and forgo wages while
- 10 ill, under quarantine, caring for their children while schools are
- 11 closed, or caring for relatives who are ill; and
- 12 Whereas, Significant action will be required to limit the
- 13 economic and social effects of this crisis. Some investors fear
- 14 that the combined effects of the COVID-19 outbreak and the measures
- 15 taken to contain the virus may lead the United States into an
- 16 economic recession or even a depression; and
- 17 Whereas, There are a number of actions available to the
- 18 federal government that would mitigate the impact of and improve
- 19 response to the COVID-19 outbreak, including: placing a moratorium
- 20 on mortgage, rent, and utility payments; prohibiting utility
- 21 shutoffs; extending the income tax filing deadline; providing
- 22 support to small businesses; increasing the availability of COVID-
- 23 19 tests; and deploying the National Guard; and
- 24 Whereas, Placing a moratorium on mortgage, rent, and utility
- 25 payments for both businesses and individuals will allow them to
- 26 weather the period of diminished income without having to decide
- 27 which necessities to prioritize. Prohibiting utility shutoffs and
- 28 evictions will also allow individuals and businesses to take the
- 29 necessary steps to prevent spreading COVID-19 without additional



- 1 and unnecessary financial concerns. In Michigan, Consumers Energy
- 2 and DTE Energy have agreed to end shutoffs for seniors and low-
- 3 income residents; however, a nationwide moratorium is necessary to
- 4 protect all residents during this crisis; and
- 5 Whereas, Providing direct financial assistance to struggling
- 6 families and individuals will help them meet their financial needs
- 7 while their income is restricted. Proposals to provide this
- 8 assistance have ranged from a universal basic income for all adults
- 9 to a refundable tax credit for low-income families. These proposals
- 10 would help those most in need to weather this period of economic
- 11 distress; and
- 12 Whereas, Extending the income tax filing deadline will allow
- 13 individuals more financial flexibility and provide hundreds of
- 14 billions of dollars of immediate equity into the market. By
- 15 delaying the deadline and granting relief from filing and payment
- 16 penalties, individuals and businesses will have more stability and
- 17 flexibility to pay for child care, medical care, and other expenses
- 18 during this unpredictable time; and
- 19 Whereas, Providing financial support to small businesses will
- 20 help to ensure that this vital part of our nation's economy is able
- 21 to survive the crisis. Many small businesses have already or will
- 22 be forced to temporarily close due to lack of demand and public
- 23 health orders. Providing support to these entrepreneurs through
- 24 low-interest loans and other means will help their businesses to
- 25 remain viable; and
- 26 Whereas, Increasing the availability of COVID-19 tests will
- 27 assist states in properly responding to this crisis. There has been
- 28 a shortage of tests to identify those infected by COVID-19 in the
- 29 United States, which has limited the ability of state and local



- 1 health officials to identify and properly isolate these
- 2 individuals; and
- 3 Whereas, Deploying the National Guard to assist states will
- 4 increase the nation's ability to respond to this crisis.
- 5 Specifically, the National Guard could assist states in high risk
- 6 areas, in medical facilities, and with sanitation efforts; now,
- 7 therefore, be it
- 8 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we memorialize
- 9 the President and Congress of the United States to take various
- 10 actions to minimize the social and financial impact of and improve
- 11 response to the COVID-19 outbreak, including: placing a moratorium
- 12 on mortgage, rent, and utility payments; prohibiting utility
- 13 shutoffs and evictions; providing direct financial support to
- 14 individuals; extending the income tax filing deadline; providing
- 15 support to small businesses; increasing availability of COVID-19
- 16 tests; and deploying the National Guard to assist states; and be it
