A resolution to recognize all of the clerks, their staff, and election workers in Michigan who made the November 3, 2020 general election possible under unprecedented circumstances.

Whereas, The November general election in Michigan saw its
highest recorded voter turnout to date with 5.56 million voters
total, which is over half a million more than the previous record
high turnout in 2008 when about 5 million people voted; and
Whereas, 2020 marks the first presidential election in which
Michigan residents could utilize no-reason absentee voting; and
