

HOUSE BILL NO. 4232

February 11, 2021, Introduced by Rep. Hoitenga and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled
"Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"
by amending section 707 (MCL 436.1707), as amended by 2008 PA 11.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 707. (1) A vendor shall not sell, serve, or furnish any
2 alcoholic liquor to ~~any~~**a** person in an intoxicated condition.

3 (2) A licensee shall not allow a person who is in an
4 intoxicated condition to consume alcoholic liquor on the licensed
5 premises.

1 (3) A licensee, or the clerk, servant, agent, or employee of a
2 licensee, shall not be in an intoxicated condition on the licensed
3 premises.

4 (4) A licensee shall not allow an intoxicated person to
5 frequent or loiter on the licensed premises except where the
6 intoxicated person has been refused service of further alcoholic
7 liquor and continues to remain on the premises for the purpose of
8 eating food, seeking medical attention, arranging transportation
9 that does not involve driving himself or herself, or any other
10 circumstances where requiring the person to vacate the premises
11 immediately would be considered dangerous to that person or to the
12 public.

13 (5) A licensee shall not allow a minor to consume alcoholic
14 liquor or to possess alcoholic liquor for personal consumption on
15 the licensed premises.

16 (6) A licensee shall not allow ~~any person~~**an individual** less
17 than ~~18~~**17** years of age to sell or serve alcoholic liquor.

18 (7) A licensee shall not allow ~~any person~~**an individual** less
19 than 18 years of age to work or entertain on a paid or voluntary
20 basis on the licensed premises unless the ~~person~~**individual** is
21 employed in compliance with the youth employment standards act,
22 1978 PA 90, MCL 409.101 to 409.124. This subsection does not apply
23 to an entertainer under the direct supervision and control of his
24 or her parent or legal guardian.

25 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
26 after the date it is enacted into law.
