HOUSE BILL NO. 4233

February 11, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Hoitenga and Markkanen and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 501 (MCL 324.501).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 501. (1) A department of natural resources for this state
- 2 is created which that shall possess the powers and perform the
- 3 duties granted and imposed by this act and as otherwise provided by
- 4 law
- 5 (2) The commission of natural resources commission is created.

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- 1 as the head of the department of natural resources and The
- 2 commission may establish general policies related to natural
- 3 resources management and environmental protection for the guidance
- 4 of the director. In addition, the commission has appellate
- 5 authority as provided in section 1101. All of the following apply:
- 6 (a) The commission shall be composed of 7 members, not more
- 7 than 4 of whom shall may be members of the same political party,
- 8 appointed by the party.
- 9 (b) The governor by and shall appoint each member, with the 10 advice and consent of the senate.
- 11 (c) A member of the commission shall be selected with special
- 12 reference to that person's individual's training and experience
- 13 related to at least 1 of the principal lines of activities vested
- 14 in the department of natural resources and the ability and fitness
- 15 of that person individual to deal with those activities.
- 16 (d) The term of office of each member of the commission shall
- **17** be 4 years.
- 18 (e) The governor shall fill a vacancy occurring in the
- 19 membership of the commission and may remove a member of the
- 20 commission for cause after a hearing.
- 21 (f) Each member of the commission shall hold office until the
- 22 appointment and qualification of that member's successor.
- 23 (g) The commission shall have at least 1 member from each
- 24 district of the court of appeals of this state. If the commission
- 25 does not have at least 1 member from each district of the court of
- 26 appeals of this state, any new member of the commission shall be
- 27 selected from a district of the court of appeals of this state that
- 28 is unrepresented on the commission until the commission has at
- 29 least 1 member from each district.

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(3) The commission, within 30 days after having qualified and 1 2 annually after that time, shall meet at its office in Lansing and organize by appointing a secretary, who need not be a member of the 3 4 commission. The governor shall appoint a chairperson of the 5 commission from among its members, who shall serve as chairperson at the pleasure of the governor. Four members of the commission 6 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The business 7 8 which that the commission may perform shall be conducted at a 9 public meeting of the commission held in compliance with the open 10 meetings act, Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976, being 11 sections 15.261 to 15.275 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. 1976 PA 12 **267**, **MCL 15.261 to 15.275**. Public notice of the time, date, and 13 place of the meeting shall be given in the manner required by Act 14 No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976. the open meetings act, 1976 PA 15 **267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.** A meeting may be called by the 16 chairperson and shall be called on request of a majority of the 17 members of the commission. A The commission may hold a meeting may 18 be held as often as necessary and at other places than the 19 commissioners' offices at Lansing. The commission shall meet at 20 least once each month. 21 (4) The commission shall appoint and employ a director who shall continue in office serves at the pleasure of the commission. 22 23 The director shall appoint 1 or more deputy directors and other 24 assistants and employees as are necessary to implement this part and any other law of this state affecting the powers and duties of 25 26 the department of natural resources. A person to whom the director

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has lawfully delegated decision making authority in writing may

perform a duty or exercise a power conferred by law upon the

department at the time and to the extent the duty and power is

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- 1 delegated to that person by the director. When a vacancy in the
- 2 office of director occurs, or the director is unable to perform the
- 3 director's duties or is absent from the state, the powers and
- 4 duties of the director as prescribed by law shall be imposed on and
- 5 transferred to a deputy director until the vacancy is filled or the
- 6 director's inability or absence from the state ceases.
- 7 (5) The compensation of the deputy directors, the assistants,
- 8 and the employees, and the number of assistants and employees,
- 9 shall be is subject to the approval of the state administrative
- 10 board. The members of the commission shall not receive compensation
- 11 under this part, but each member and the other officers and
- 12 employees of the department of natural resources shall be are
- 13 entitled to reasonable expenses while traveling in the performance
- 14 of their duties prescribed by this act. The salaries and expenses
- 15 authorized under this act shall be paid out of the state treasury
- 16 in the same manner as the salaries of other state officers and
- 17 employees are paid. The department of technology, management, and
- 18 budget shall furnish suitable offices and office equipment, at
- 19 Lansing, for the use of the department of natural resources. Each
- 20 member of the commission and the director shall qualify by taking
- 21 and subscribing to the constitutional oath of office prescribed in
- 22 section 1 of article XI of the state constitution of 1963 and by
- 23 filing it in the office of the secretary of state.
