HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 108

Reps. Outman, Roth, Eisen, Borton, Fink, Beson, Maddock, Carra, Bezotte, Martin, Markkanen, Allor, Beeler, Damoose, O'Malley, Wozniak, Paquette, Reilly, LaFave, and Meerman offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to oppose the Green New Deal and encourage our
- 2 local, state, and national leaders to pursue smart, evidence-based
- 3 regulatory practices.
- 4 Whereas, In 2021, U.S. House Resolution 332 and U.S. Senate
- 5 Resolution 166 were introduced in Congress recognizing the duty of
- 6 the federal government to create a Green New Deal. The Green New
- 7 Deal calls for an elimination of greenhouse gas emissions through
- 8 public works projects and federal regulation; and
- 9 Whereas, The projects proposed in the Green New Deal would be
- 10 extremely expensive. One analysis estimated the cost could be as

- 1 high as \$93 trillion over 10 years, which would lead to crippling
- 2 new taxes and debt; and
- 3 Whereas, Achieving the goals set out in the Green New Deal may

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- 4 not be technologically feasible in the 10-year timeframe. This
- 5 unreasonable timeframe will burden businesses trying to meet
- 6 impossible federal mandates; and
- 7 Whereas, Rather than allow efficient market forces to put
- 8 pressure on businesses to lower greenhouse gas emissions, business
- 9 decisions will be based on the whims of federal regulation. The
- 10 excessive environmental regulations proposed in the Green New Deal
- 11 will negatively impact well established American industries
- 12 including trucking, automobile, and agriculture. Economic
- 13 development will be stifled and consumers and employees will bear
- 14 the brunt with increased product costs, possible job loss, and
- 15 reduced employee wages; and
- 16 Whereas, There is no justification for the enormous economic
- 17 harm this deal will cause, especially if it cannot meet its stated
- 18 goals; now, therefore, be it
- 19 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we oppose the
- 20 Green New Deal as outlined in U.S. House Resolution 332 and U.S.
- 21 Senate Resolution 166; and be it further
- 22 Resolved, That we encourage our local, state, and national
- 23 leaders to pursue smart, evidence-based regulatory practice; and be
- 24 it further
- 25 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the
- 26 President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United
- 27 States House of Representatives, and the members of the Michigan
- 28 congressional delegation.
