A bill to amend 1956 PA 218, entitled "The insurance code of 1956," (MCL 500.100 to 500.8302) by adding sections 3406z, 3901a, and 4002.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 3406z. (1) This section applies to disability insurance
 policies or certificates delivered or issued for delivery after
 December 31, 2023.

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(2) Unless there is an additional actuarial risk, as

1 determined in accordance with sound actuarial principles as well as 2 the individual's actual and reasonably anticipated experience, an 3 insurer shall not do any of the following with respect to a 4 disability insurance policy or certificate based solely on the 5 individual's status as a living donor: 6 (a) Deny coverage. 7 (b) Cancel coverage. 8 (c) Refuse to issue the policy or certificate. 9 (d) Determine the price or premium for the policy or 10 certificate. 11 (e) Otherwise vary a term or condition of the policy or 12 certificate. 13 (3) As used in this section: 14 (a) "Living donor" means an individual who is not deceased and 15 has donated any of the following: 16 (*i*) All or part of an organ. 17 (*ii*) A tissue. 18 (b) "Organ" means a human kidney, liver, heart, lung, 19 pancreas, esophagus, stomach, or small or large intestine, a 20 portion of the human gastrointestinal tract, or another part of the 21 human body designated by the department by rule. 22 (c) "Tissue" means a portion of the human body other than an 23 organ, including, but not limited to, an eye, skin, bone, bone 24 marrow, a heart valve, a spermatozoon, an ova, an artery, a vein, a 25 tendon, a ligament, blood, blood derivatives, a pituitary gland, or 26 fluid. 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(2) Unless there is an additional actuarial risk, as 1 2 determined in accordance with sound actuarial principles as well as 3 the individual's actual and reasonably anticipated experience, an 4 insurer shall not do any of the following with respect to a longterm care insurance policy or certificate based solely on the 5 6 individual's status as a living donor: 7 (a) Deny coverage. 8 (b) Cancel coverage. 9 (c) Refuse to issue the policy or certificate. insurer shall not do any of the following with respect to a life
insurance policy or certificate based solely on the individual's
status as a living donor:

11 (d) Determine the price or premium for the policy or 12 certificate.

13 (e) Otherwise vary a term or condition of the policy or14 certificate.
