HOUSE BILL NO. 5873

June 27, 2024, Introduced by Reps. Mentzer, Arbit, Shannon, Martus, Conlin, Xiong, Brixie, Andrews and Hood and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 2045 (MCL 324.2045), as amended by 2013 PA 81.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 2045. (1) The department shall distribute recreation
 passport fee revenue as follows:
- 3 (a) First, for necessary expenses incurred by the secretary of4 state each state fiscal year in administration and implementation
- 5 of section 805 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL

- 1 257.805. Funds appropriated for necessary expenses shall be based
- 2 upon an established cost allocation methodology that reflects
- 3 actual costs. Appropriations under this subdivision in a state
- 4 fiscal year shall not exceed \$1,000,000.00.
- 5 (b) The next \$10,700,000.00 received each fiscal year shall be
- 6 deposited in the state park improvement account.
- 7 (c) The next \$1,030,000.00 received each fiscal year shall be
- 8 deposited in the waterways account.
- 9 (d) The remaining revenue If the amount of recreation passport
- 10 revenue collected in a state fiscal year does not exceed
- 11 \$46,500,000.00, as adjusted under subsection (2), the revenue
- 12 remaining after the application of subdivisions (a) to (c) and
- 13 subsection (3) shall be deposited and used as follows:
- 14 (i) 50% in the state park improvement account to be used for
- 15 capital improvements at state parks, including state recreation
- 16 areas.
- 17 (ii) 30% in the state park improvement account to be used for
- 18 operations and maintenance at state parks, including state
- 19 recreation areas.
- 20 (iii) 2.75% in the state park improvement account to be used for
- 21 operations, maintenance, and capital improvements of state park
- 22 cultural and historic resources.
- (iv) 0.25% in the state park improvement account to be used to
- 24 do all of the following:
- 25 (A) Promote, in concert with other state agencies, the use of
- 26 state parks, state-operated public boating access sites, state
- 27 forest campgrounds, and state forest nonmotorized trails and
- 28 pathways.
- 29 (B) Promote the use of the internet for state park camping

- 1 reservations and for payment of the recreation passport fee in
- 2 conjunction with motor vehicle registration.
- $\mathbf{3}$ (v) 10% in the local public recreation facilities fund created
- 4 in section 1911, to be used for development of public recreation
- 5 facilities for local units of government.
- 6 (vi) 7% in the forest recreation account to be used for
- 7 operating, maintaining, and making capital improvements to state
- 8 forest campgrounds and the state forest system of pathways and
- 9 nonmotorized trails, including, but not limited to, equestrian
- 10 trails.
- 11 (e) If the amount of recreation passport revenue collected in
- 12 a state fiscal year exceeds \$46,500,000.00, as adjusted under
- 13 subsection (2), the revenue remaining after the application of
- 14 subdivisions (a) to (c) and subsection (3) shall be deposited and
- 15 used as follows:
- 16 (i) 70% in the state park improvement account to be used for
- 17 capital improvements, operations, and maintenance at state parks,
- 18 including state recreation areas.
- 19 (ii) 2.75% in the state park improvement account to be used for
- 20 the purposes described in subdivision (d) (iii).
- 21 (iii) 0.25% in the state park improvement account to be used for
- 22 the purposes described in subdivision (d) (iv).
- 23 (iv) 20% in the local public recreation facilities fund created
- 24 in section 1911, to be used for the purposes described in
- 25 subdivision (d) (v).
- 26 (v) 7% in the forest recreation account to be used for the
- 27 purposes described in subdivision (d) (vi).
- 28 (2) For each state fiscal year, beginning with the 2025-2026
- 29 state fiscal year, the state treasurer shall adjust the

- 1 \$46,500,000.00 amount set forth in subsection (1)(d) and (e) by an
- 2 amount determined by the state treasurer to reflect the cumulative
- 3 percentage change in the Consumer Price Index since October 1,
- 4 2024, as of the most recent 1-year period for which data are
- 5 available.
- 6 (3) $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$ For each state fiscal year, beginning with the 2011-
- 7 2012 state fiscal year, the state treasurer shall adjust the
- 8 amounts set forth in subsection (1)(b) and (c) by an amount
- 9 determined by the state treasurer to reflect the cumulative
- 10 percentage change in the consumer price index for Consumer Price
- 11 Index since October 1, 2010, as of the most recent 1-year period
- 12 for which data are available. As used in this subsection, "consumer
- 13 price index" means the most comprehensive index of consumer prices
- 14 available for this state from the bureau of labor statistics of the
- 15 United States department of labor.
- 16 (4) (3)—By January 15 of each year, the department, in
- 17 consultation with the department of state, shall estimate the
- 18 amount of additional revenue that would have been collected as
- 19 recreation passport fees during the immediately preceding state
- 20 fiscal year if owners of resident motor vehicles described in
- 21 sections 74116(4)(c) and 78119(4)(b) were not exempt under those
- 22 provisions from paying the recreation passport fee. The department
- 23 shall estimate the amount as follows:
- 24 (a) Determine the total number of resident motor vehicles
- **25** described in sections 74116(4)(c) and 78119(4)(b).
- 26 (b) Multiply the number under subdivision (a) by the
- 27 percentage of resident motor vehicles with single-year
- 28 registrations for which a recreation passport fee was paid during
- 29 the preceding state fiscal year.

- 1 (c) Subtract from the result under subdivision (b) the number 2 of resident motor vehicles described in sections 74116(4)(c) and 3 78119(4)(b) for which a recreation passport fee was paid during the 4 preceding state fiscal year under rules promulgated under section
- 6 (d) Multiply the result under subdivision (c) by the current7 amount of the recreation passport fee during the preceding state8 fiscal year.

- 9 (5) (4)—The legislature shall annually appropriate from the 10 general fund a sum equal to the amount estimated under subsection 11 (3). (4). The sum appropriated shall be distributed as provided in 12 subsection (1)(d) or (e), as applicable.
 - (6) (5)—The department shall submit a report to the standing committees and appropriations subcommittees of the legislature with jurisdiction over issues pertaining to natural resources and the environment by February 1 each year. The report shall provide information on all of the following for the preceding state fiscal year:
- (a) The total amount of recreation passport fee revenue
 received by the department and the amounts allocated under
 subsection (1).
- (b) The total amount of annual and daily state park motor
 vehicle permit fee revenue received by the department under section
 74117.
- (c) The total amount of seasonal or daily state-operated
 public boating access site revenue received by the department under
 section 78105(3).
- (d) Details on the specific uses of the revenue described insubdivisions (a), (b), and (c) and the amounts expended for each

- (e) The amount of revenue received during the preceding state
 fiscal year under subsection (4).(5).
- 4 (f) The adequacy of the revenue described in subdivisions (a)
 5 and (e) for each of the purposes for which it is allocated under
 6 subsection (1).
 - (g) The impact of the state park revenue stream described in subdivisions (a), (b), and (d) on the Michigan state parks endowment fund created in section 35a of article IX of the state constitution of 1963 and provided for in section 74119.
 - (h) Other relevant issues that affect funding needs for the state park system.
- 13 (7) $\frac{(6)}{(6)}$ By February 1, 2012 and every 2 years thereafter, the 14 department shall submit a report to the standing committees and 15 appropriations subcommittees of the legislature with jurisdiction 16 over issues pertaining to natural resources and the environment. 17 The report shall provide information on how frequently motor 18 vehicles for which the registrant declined to pay the recreation passport fee entered state parks and state-operated public boating 19 20 access sites designated under section 78105 during the registration period. The information shall be based on random audits conducted 21 22 by the department. A report under this subsection may be combined 23 with a report required under subsection (5). (6).
 - (8) (7)—The department may prepare a list of frequently asked questions and answers concerning the recreation passport fee. The department and the department of state may post the information on their websites. The department of state may provide the information with any applications for registration of motor vehicles that are mailed by the department of state.

1 (9) As used in this section, "Consumer Price Index" means the 2 most comprehensive index of consumer prices available for this 3 state from the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States 4 Department of Labor.
