## **SENATE BILL NO. 353**

May 23, 2023, Introduced by Senators KLINEFELT and SINGH and referred to the Committee on Energy and Environment.

A bill to amend 2012 PA 615, entitled "Michigan energy assistance act,"

by amending sections 2 and 4 (MCL 400.1232 and 400.1234).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Crisis" means 1 of the following:
- 3 (i) An individual or recipient has received a past due notice
- 4 on an energy bill for his or her household.
- 5 (ii) A residential fuel tank is estimated to contain not more
- 6 than 25% of its heating fuel capacity.

- 1 (iii) A stated need for deliverable fuel or a nontraditional
- 2 fuel source in which there is no meter or regular energy bill
- 3 provided.
- 4 (iv) A notice that the balance in a prepayment account is below
- 5 a minimum amount.
- 6 (a) (b) "Department" means the department of health and human
- 7 services.
- 8 (b) (c) "Eligible low-income household" means a household with
- 9 a household income of not more than  $\frac{150\%}{200\%}$  of the federal
- 10 poverty guidelines.
- 11 (c) (d) "Energy assistance" means a program to assist eligible
- 12 low-income households in meeting their home energy costs for their
- 13 primary residence through payment or partial payment of bills for 1
- 14 or more of the following:
- 15 (i) Electricity.
- 16 (ii) Natural gas.
- **17** (*iii*) Propane.
- 18 (iv) Heating oil.
- 19 (v) Any other deliverable fuel used to provide heat.
- 20 (d) <del>(e)</del> "Federal poverty guidelines" means the poverty
- 21 guidelines published annually in the federal register by the United
- 22 States department of health and human services Department of Health
- 23 and Human Services under its authority to revise the poverty line
- 24 under section 673(2) of subtitle B of title VI of the omnibus
- 25 budget reconciliation act of 1981, 42 USC 9902.
- (e) (f) "Funds" means a portion of the money received from the
- 27 federal low income home energy assistance program block grant that
- 28 is not used for the home heating credit, money received from the
- 29 low-income energy assistance fund, or any other money appropriated

- 1 for this program.
- 2 (f) (g) "Program" means the Michigan energy assistance program
  3 established in section 3.
- Sec. 4. (1) The department shall only use money from the lowincome energy assistance fund for energy assistance.
- 6 (2) Money from the low-income energy assistance fund may be
- 7 used for the program's crisis season, which begins on November 1
- 8 and ends May 31 each year. Not more than 30% of the funds received
- 9 for the program shall be spent outside of the crisis season.
