## **SENATE BILL NO. 544**

October 03, 2023, Introduced by Senators KLINEFELT, CHANG and SHINK and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Affairs.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

(MCL 339.101 to 339.2677) by adding article 18A.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 ARTICLE 18A
- 2 Sec. 1851. As used in this article:
- 3 (a) "Applicant" means a person that submits an application for
- 4 license or certificate of registration under this article.
- 5 Applicant includes each individual identified in the application as

- 1 an owner, operator, officer, director, partner, member, or manager
- 2 of the applicant.
- 3 (b) "Authorized person" means an entity listed in section
- 4 1857.
- 5 (c) "Authorized vehicle" means a vehicle, used by a removal
- 6 service to transport a dead human body, that has passed an
- 7 inspection by the department under section 1855.
- 8 (d) "County medical examiner" means an individual appointed to
- 9 that position under 1953 PA 181, MCL 52.201 to 52.216.
- 10 (e) "Crematory owner" means a person that owns a crematory and
- 11 holds a valid permit issued under section 14 of the cemetery
- 12 regulation act, 1968 PA 251, MCL 456.534.
- 13 (f) "Funeral establishment" means that term as defined in
- 14 section 1801.
- 15 (g) "Health facility" means a health facility or agency
- 16 licensed under article 17 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- 17 MCL 333.20101 to 333.22260.
- 18 (h) "Holder of a license for the practice of mortuary science"
- 19 means that term as defined in section 1801.
- 20 (i) "Holding room" means a room equipped with a refrigeration
- 21 unit within a refrigeration facility wherein a dead human body is
- 22 stored.
- 23 (j) "Licensee" means a person that holds a refrigeration
- 24 facility license issued under section 1853.
- 25 (k) "Medical school" means that term as defined in section
- 26 2701 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2701.
- 27 (1) "Organ procurement organization" means that term as defined
- 28 in section 10102 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 29 333.10102.

- 1 (m) "Practice of mortuary science" means that term as defined 2 in section 1801.
- 3 (n) "Refrigeration facility" means a place of business that
- 4 operates independently of a funeral establishment or crematory
- 5 owner that maintains a holding room.
- 6 (o) "Registrant" means a person that holds a removal service 7 certificate of registration issued under section 1855.
- 8 (p) "Removal service" means a professional service that
- 9 operates independently of a funeral establishment that handles the
- 10 initial removal of a dead human body and transports the dead human
- 11 body in an authorized vehicle to and from an authorized person.
- 12 Sec. 1853. (1) A person shall not operate a refrigeration
- 13 facility without a refrigeration facility license.
- 14 (2) The department shall issue a refrigeration facility
- 15 license that is valid for 2 years to an applicant that meets all of
- 16 the following conditions:
- 17 (a) Submits an application to the department with all of the
- 18 following information:
- 19 (i) The name of the applicant.
- (ii) The name of the individual who will serve as the manager
- 21 of the refrigeration facility as described in section 1859.
- 22 (iii) The address of the refrigeration facility.
- (iv) The name that the applicant will use to conduct business.
- 24 (v) Any other information required by the department.
- 25 (b) The applicant discloses the applicant's criminal history
- 26 to the department.
- 27 (c) The applicant is of good moral character.
- 28 (d) The refrigeration facility and location listed on the
- 29 application pass an inspection conducted by the department.

- 1 (3) A license issued under this section is valid for only the location of the refrigeration facility listed in the application.
- 3 (4) A licensee shall report a change in the location of the
- 4 refrigeration facility immediately to the department as prescribed
- 5 by rule. A licensee shall not operate a refrigeration facility at a
- 6 new location until the department conducts an inspection of the
- 7 facility and the facility passes the inspection.
- 8 (5) The department shall assess a fee against a licensee that
- 9 does not renew a license within 30 days after the expiration date
- 10 of the license and continues to operate as a refrigeration
- 11 facility.
- 12 Sec. 1855. (1) The department shall issue a removal service
- 13 certificate of registration that is valid for 2 years to an
- 14 applicant that meets all of the following conditions:
- 15 (a) Submits an application to the department with all of the
- 16 following information:
- 17 (i) The name of the applicant.
- 18 (ii) The name of the individual who will serve as the manager
- 19 of the removal service.
- 20 (iii) The address of the removal service.
- (iv) The name that the applicant will use to conduct business.
- 22 (v) Any other information required by the department.
- 23 (b) The applicant discloses the applicant's criminal history
- 24 to the department.
- 25 (c) The applicant is of good moral character.
- 26 (d) Each vehicle used by the applicant to transport a dead
- 27 human body meets certain requirements, including, but not limited
- 28 to, all of the following as determined by the department after the
- 29 department conducts an inspection of the vehicle:

- 1 (i) Is enclosed.
- 2 ( $\ddot{u}$ ) Is constructed to secure the dead human body face up 3 within the vehicle.
- 4 (iii) Is used only for the retrieval and transport of a dead 5 human body.
- 6 (2) The department shall issue a decal to a registrant that
  7 indicates the vehicle is an authorized vehicle. Display of the
  8 decal must be as prescribed by rule.
- 9 (3) A registrant shall use only an authorized vehicle to transport a dead human body.
- 11 (4) The department may assess a fee to a registrant that does 12 not renew a certificate of registration within 30 days after the 13 expiration date of the certificate of registration and continues to 14 operate as a removal service.
- 15 Sec. 1857. A licensee or registrant shall not contract to 16 provide services under this article unless the contract is with any 17 of the following entities:
- 18 (a) A health facility.
- 19 (b) A county medical examiner.
- 20 (c) A funeral establishment.
- 21 (d) A medical school.
- 22 (e) An organ procurement organization.
- 23 Sec. 1859. (1) A refrigeration facility shall designate a
- 24 holder of a license for the practice of mortuary science as a
- 25 manager of the refrigeration facility. The manager shall supervise
- 26 the handling and sheltering of a dead human body at the
- 27 refrigeration facility. The manager shall not otherwise engage in
- 28 the practice of mortuary science while acting as a manager for a
- 29 refrigeration facility.

- 1 (2) A holder of a license for the practice of mortuary science
- 2 shall not manage more than 1 refrigeration facility. A holder of a
- 3 license for the practice of mortuary science who manages a funeral
- 4 establishment under section 1809 shall not manage a refrigeration
- 5 facility.
- 6 (3) A manager of a refrigeration facility shall not reside
- 7 more than 100 miles from the refrigeration facility.
- 8 Sec. 1861. (1) After the receipt of a dead human body by a
- 9 licensed refrigeration facility, any of the following persons shall
- 10 conduct a reasonable good-faith effort to locate the individual who
- 11 has the right to make decisions related to the dead human body as
- 12 described in section 3206 of the estates and protected individuals
- 13 code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.3206, to receive authorization from the
- 14 individual to transfer the dead human body to a licensed funeral
- 15 establishment:
- 16 (a) A family member, personal representative, or nominated
- 17 personal representative of the decedent.
- 18 (b) A health facility or veteran's facility that provided
- 19 medical treatment to the decedent during the final illness or
- 20 immediately before the decedent's death.
- 21 (c) The manager of the refrigeration facility.
- 22 (2) On receipt of a dead human body, a licensee, manager, or
- 23 other authorized personnel shall ensure that a dead human body
- 24 stored at a refrigeration facility is handled in the following
- 25 manner:
- 26 (a) Is stored at a temperature between 36 degrees Fahrenheit
- 27 and 39 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 28 (b) Is clothed or covered while being refrigerated.
- 29 (c) Is not stored directly on the ground.

- 1 (d) Is stored as only 1 dead human body per table tray or
- 2 container, unless otherwise authorized by a person who has
- 3 authority to make arrangements for a dead human body under section
- 4 3206 of the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386,
- 5 MCL 700.3206.
- 6 (e) Is face up while being stored or transported.
- 7 (f) Is not stored over another dead human body, unless the
- 8 dead human body is stored on a rack that has sufficient strength to
- 9 support the dead human body.
- 10 Sec. 1863. A refrigeration facility must have a holding room
- 11 that meets all of the following:
- 12 (a) Is not accessible by the general public.
- 13 (b) Maintains a temperature between 36 degrees Fahrenheit and
- 14 39 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 15 (c) Complies with all other applicable public health and
- 16 safety laws.
- 17 Sec. 1865. (1) A registrant shall not transport a dead human
- 18 body unless either of the following applies:
- 19 (a) The registrant has received authorization to transport a
- 20 dead human body from a holder of a license for the practice of
- 21 mortuary science, a county medical examiner, or an organ
- 22 procurement agency.
- 23 (b) The registrant is transferring a dead human body from a
- 24 health facility to a licensed refrigeration facility.
- 25 (2) A registrant must have equipment that includes, but is not
- 26 limited to, the following:
- 27 (a) 1 lightweight and 1 heavyweight body bag.
- 28 (b) A cot that is secured or restrained inside an authorized
- 29 vehicle to prevent movement during transport.

- 1 (c) A cot cover for each cot used.
- 2 (d) A first-aid kit.
- 3 (e) A fire extinguisher.
- 4 (f) Protective clothing that meets the needs of the
- 5 registrant's employees that accompany the removal of a dead human
- 6 body, including, but not limited to, disposable gowns, shoe covers,
- 7 protective eyewear, gloves, masks, or waterproof aprons.
- 8 (3) A registrant shall maintain the equipment listed under
- 9 subsection (2) in a clean and sanitary manner and have it available
- 10 whenever a dead human body is stored or in transit.
- 11 (4) A registrant shall disinfect a container that was used in
- 12 the removal of a dead human body after the removal and before the
- 13 container is used again.
- 14 Sec. 1867. (1) A registrant that transports a dead human body
- 15 in an authorized vehicle must do all of the following:
- 16 (a) Conceal the body from public view.
- 17 (b) Place the body face up in a body bag or rigid container to
- 18 withstand transportation and prevent bodily fluids from leaking and
- 19 odors from escaping.
- 20 (c) Transport the body with a transportation permit issued
- 21 under section 1807.
- 22 (2) A registrant shall maintain the authorized vehicle and
- 23 equipment used to transport a dead human body in a clean and
- 24 sanitary manner.
- 25 (3) If an authorized vehicle can hold more than 1 dead human
- 26 body, the dead human bodies must be placed face up in separate body
- 27 bags or containers and secured with space between the bodies to
- 28 prevent the contact of a dead human body with another.
- 29 Sec. 1869. An employee of a licensee or registrant must

- 1 possess identification of the employee's employer that includes the
- 2 employer's license or registration number and the employer's name.
- 3 Sec. 1871. (1) The department shall establish a system for the
- 4 identification of a dead human body received for removal by a
- 5 licensee or registrant. The identification system must be able to
- 6 track the identity of the dead human body from the time the body is
- 7 received by a licensee or registrant to the time the dead human
- 8 body is delivered to an authorized person.
- 9 (2) After the initial inspection for licensure or
- 10 certification, the department may conduct a random inspection of a
- 11 facility, location, or vehicle of a licensee or registrant. A
- 12 licensee or registrant shall allow a representative of the
- 13 department to enter the licensee's or registrant's premises during
- 14 regular business hours to inspect and determine whether the
- 15 facility, location, or vehicles meet the requirements of this
- 16 article or rules promulgated under this article.
- 17 (3) The department shall promulgate rules to implement this
- 18 article under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA
- 19 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328.
- 20 Sec. 1873. A licensee or registrant must comply with all
- 21 local, state, and federal laws that apply to the licensee or
- 22 registrant.
- 23 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 24 unless Senate Bill No. 545 of the 102nd Legislature is enacted into
- 25 law.
