AN ACT to prohibit the expenditure of state funds for the purpose of human cloning.
The $P$ eople of the State of Michigan enact:

### 333.26401 Short title. [M.S.A. 14.15(26401)]

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "the human cloning funding prohibition act".

### 333.26402 "Human cloning" defined. [M.S.A. 14.15(26402)]

Sec. 2. A s used in this act, "human cloning" means that term as defined in section 16274 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16274.

### 333.26403 Human cloning; prohibited conduct. [M.S.A. 14.15(26403)]

Sec. 3. A person shall not use state funds to engage in or attempt to engage in human cloning.

### 333.26404 Exception. [M.S.A. 14.15(26404)]

Sec. 4. Section 3 does not prohibit the use of state funds for scientific research or cellbased therapies not specifically prohibited by that section.

### 333.26405 Private right of action. [M.S.A. 14.15(26405)]

Sec. 5. This act does not give a person a private right of action.

### 333.26406 Violation; penalty. [M.S.A. 14.15(26406)]

Sec. 6. A person who violates section 3 is subject to a civil fine of $\$ 10,000,000.00$. A civil fine imposed under this section shall be distributed in the same manner in which penal fines are distributed in this state.

E nacting section 1. This act does not take effect unless all of the following bills of the 89th L egislature are enacted into law:
(a) H ouse Bill No. 4846.
(b) H ouse Bill No. 4962.
(c) Senate Bill No. 864.
